EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

After a thorough review, the National Economic Council decided that it would be more convenient for the Federal and State Governments if Nigeria aligned its financial year to the calendar year instead of the period of 12 months ending on 31st March as January to December is more in keeping with realities in this country. The Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1979 has also defined financial year in the erstwhile traditional manner but has permitted its alteration by an Act of the National Assembly.

The purpose of this Bill is to appoint January to December as the financial year to be henceforth observed in Nigeria but as a transitional measure, it is provided therein that 1st April to 31st December of this year shall be the 1980 financial year. The Bill incorporates the foregoing and in addition makes consequential amendment to the definition of financial year in the Interpretation Act 1964, which Act is used for interpreting all other Federal enactments and the Constitution itself.
