MOTOR VEHICLES, TRANSIT TO AND
FROM DAHOMEY AND NIGERIA

1. It is notified for general information that the following Rules have been approved by the Governments of Dahomey and the Federation of Nigeria for the control of vehicular traffic from Dahomey to Nigeria and *vice versa* and shall come into force from the date of publication in the *Official Gazette* :

(A) PASSAGE OF BRITISH VEHICLES THROUGH
AND IN DAHOMEY

I—All persons travelling on such vehicles must be in possession of either :

- (a) valid passports
- (b) travel certificates

II—Those persons in possession of passports who desire to stay up to 10 (ten) days in Dahomey require transit visas which can be obtained at the French Consulate-General in Lagos. No visas are required in respect of travel certificates.

III—Each vehicle must have a current Nigerian Motor Vehicle Licence and an International Certificate for Motor Vehicles and drivers of vehicles must be in possession of the International Driving Licence.

IV—All vehicles (with the exception of government owned vehicles whether civil or military) must be insured against risks to third parties without limit of liability and must carry a certificate or other document issued by the insurer giving evidence that such insurance is valid in the territory of Dahomey.

V—All vehicles must report at the first French Customs and Police posts after entering Dahomey.

VI—Military vehicles travelling through Dahomey to the Gold Coast only require a route permit which may be signed by a Military Officer of or above the rank of Lieutenant. One route permit may be issued to cover any number of military vehicles travelling in convoy.

VII—A vehicle owned by the Nigerian Government will require a route permit which must be signed by a Superior Police Officer.

(B) PASSAGE OF FRENCH VEHICLES IN NIGERIA

I—All persons travelling on such vehicles must be in possession of either :

- (a) valid passports

(b) travel certificates (*cartes de voyage*) and must report to the Immigration Authorities at the point of entry.

II—All vehicles require "*cartes grises*" (i.e. French vehicle licence) and an International Certificate for Motor Vehicles and the drivers must be in possession of an International Driving Licence or of a French driving license of the new pink triple-fold type which is issued in conformance with the Geneva agreement.

III—Those persons in possession of passports who are not British Subjects must be in possession of a valid *visa* issued by an appropriate British Authority.

IV—All vehicles entering Nigeria must report at the first Customs Post and Immigration office in Nigeria for examination.

V—Vehicles entering Nigeria must be insured against third party risks incurred in Nigeria.
