WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of August, 1954, known as the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, provision is made, among other things, for the constitution and powers of a House of Representatives for the Federation of Nigeria :

AND WHEREAS by the said Order in Council it is further provided that the Governor-General may at any time by Proclamation published in the *Official Gazette* of the Federation prorogue the said House of Representatives :

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the tenth day of January, 1957, the third session of the said House of Representatives was appointed to commence on the twenty-eighth day of February, 1957 :

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said House of Representatives should be prorogued :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES WILSON ROBERTSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said House of Representatives with effect from the first day of February, 1958.

MINIMUM PRODUCER PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Western Region Marketing Board Law (No. 10 of 1954), has fixed the prices set out in Columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for technical palm oil during 1958 at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in Column 1.

2. The minimum prices are based as in previous years on the naked ex-scale Bulk Oil Plant prices less the appropriate cost of transport by the approved normal evacuation routes. Where applicable, the middlemen's allowance of £1-4s-6d per ton has been taken into account in calculating the buying station prices.

3. *Produce Sales Tax.*—Under the provisions of the Sale of Produce (Taxation) (Western Region) Order in Council, 1953, made under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, all sales of technical palm oil made in the Western Region to the licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to produce sales tax at the rate of £1 per ton.

4. For purposes of collection of this tax for which under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of technical palm oil made to it or its licensed buying agents in the Region, the arrangements as set out in paragraph 5, are prescribed.

5. The prices payable by licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for technical palm oil in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns 5, 6 and 7 of the Schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of the produce sales tax).
