Whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of August, 1954, known as the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, provision is made, among other things, for the constitution and powers of a House of Representatives for the Federation of Nigeria:

AND WHEREAS by the said Order in Council it is further provided that the Governor-General may at any time by Proclamation published in the Official Gazette of the Federation prorogue the said House of Representatives:

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the tenth day of January, 1957, the third session of the said House of Representatives was appointed to commence on the twenty-eighth day of February, 1957:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said House of Representatives should be prorogued:

Now, THEREFORE, I, JAMES WILSON ROBERTSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said House of Representatives with effect from the first day of February, 1958.

Government Notice No. 89

Education (Lagos) Ordinance, No. 26 of 1957 LAND REQUIRED FOR THE SERVICE OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Under section 33 (i) (b) of the Ordinance, I declare that the site herein described is required by the Government of the Federation for the purpose of building a school.

DESCRIPTION

All that piece of land at Ondo and Griffith Streets, Ebute Metts, in the Federal Territory of Nigeria, comprising an area of approximately 177.32 square yards the boundaries of which are described below.

Starting at a concrete pillar marked LD5263 the co-ordinates of which are 1174.85 South and 4541.23 East of a concrete pillar marked L.C.S.165P, the origin of Lagos Cadastral Surveys, the boundaries run in straight lines the bearings and lengths of
