MOTOR TRAFFIC: NIGERIA-TCHAD TERRITORY

Consequent upon the agreement made between the Governments of French Equatorial Africa and the Federation of Nigeria to control the movement of motor vehicles between Maiduguri and Fort Lamy, which will come into force on the 1st January, 1958, the attention of the public is drawn to the following instructions:—

General Instructions.—Vehicles travelling to Fort Lamy from Maiduguri must use either the all season road Maiduguri-Gamboru-Fort Lamy, or the dry season route Bama-Dar al Jimeil-Marua.

On leaving or entering Nigeria the driver of each vehicle must report to the Police Check Point at Gamboru or Bama and present the following documents to be stamped by the Police with the date of entry or exit:

(a) International Driving Licence,

(b) International Certificate for motor vehicles.

After leaving the check point at the frontier the driver and his vehicle must report forthwith to the nearest Customs and Immigration Authorities and must not pick up or set down, passengers or freight, on the way.

No vehicle may remain in Tchad Territory for longer than a total of 120 days in any calendar year unless a French Licence is obtained for that vehicle.

Nigerian vehicles in Tchad Territory will be required to conform with Road Traffic Regulations in force in that Territory.

Documents.—The drivers of motor vehicles must be in possession of:—

(1) a valid international certificate for motor vehicles;

(2) a valid international driving licence; both (1) and (2) may be obtained either from the Central Motor Registry, Kakawa Street, Lagos or the Motor Licensing Office, Maiduguri.

(3) a valid insurance certificate against Third Party risks in respect of their vehicle, issued by a recognised Insurance Company and indicating on the certificate that such insurance is valid in the French Territory of the Tchad, and is without limit of liability.

(4) a valid passport or travel certificate.

Passports must be endorsed for Tchad Territory but in the case of residents of Nigeria no advance notice of arrival or consular visa is required provided a short visit only is intended.

Travel Certificates require no visa and no immigration deposits will be taken from Nigerians travelling to Fort Lamy for short visits.

Passengers.—Passengers should similarly be in possession of either a valid passport or travel certificate.

AWARD OF FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS, BURSARIES AND STATE SCHOLARSHIPS, 1958-59

The Federal Government proposes to offer, subject to the provision of the necessary funds by the House of Representatives, bursaries, scholarships and State scholarships to become available in the years 1958 and 1959. Twenty State Scholarships will be awarded, ten tenable at the University College, Ibadan, and ten tenable at the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology. These scholarships will be awarded by His Excellency the Governor-General on the recommendation of the Principals of the Colleges.

2. Candidates in the following categories will be eligible to apply for scholarships and bursaries to be awarded by His Excellency the Governor-General on the advice of the Federal Scholarships Advisory Board:—

(i) Those born or permanently domiciled in the Federal Territory of Lagos and the Southern Cameroons;

(ii) Staff serving in Federal Departments and in branches of other departments or inter-territorial institutions for which the Federal Government is responsible;

(iii) Applicants born or domiciled anywhere within the Federation who wish to seek the requisite qualifications for ultimate appointment to the Federal Public Service in senior administrative, executive or professional grades of the Federal Service;

(iv) Existing staff of autonomous bodies for which the Federal Government is responsible, who are seeking training for administrative, executive or professional posts.

Candidates who are selected for awards under the above categories will be required to sign an undertaking to serve or to continue to serve as directed by the Federal Government on completion of their courses. Those selected under category (iv) will be required to continue to serve their present employers.

3. The Federal Government awards for the years 1958-59 will be closely geared to the staffing needs of the Government and first consideration will be given to applicants who appear most likely to fit in with those needs. Applications for the following courses will receive first consideration:—

(i) Honours Degree Courses in Arts or Science; B.A. (Hons.) in Mathematics or Classics or English or Geography or History; B.Sc. (Special) in Mathematics or Botany or Zoology or Physics or Chemistry or Geography.

(ii) Professional Degree Courses in Forestry, Agriculture, Veterinary Science, Pharmacy, Medicine, Geology and Engineering, B.A. or B.Sc. (Honours) in Forestry and Geology, B.Sc. Agriculture, M.R.C.V.S., B.V.Sc., Ph.C. or B. Pharm., M.B., B.S. (London), B.Sc. (Engineering).

(iii) General Degree Courses—B.A. (General), B.Sc. (General).

(iv) Other Professional Courses—In Engineering A.M.I.E.E., A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I.Mech.E., in Survey and Valuation, A.R.I.C.S., in Architecture, A.R.I.B.A.; in Accountancy, A.C.C.A. and A.I.C.W.A.

(v) Miscellaneous Courses: Shipping Navigation Courses; Mate and Master Mariner's Certificate, Marine Engineers' Certificate.

(vi) Teacher Training Courses: Diploma in Education, Professional Teachers' Certificate.

4. Applications for scholarships and bursaries may be made by candidates of either sex, preference normally being given to those under 30 years of age. Candidates will be required to have completed a full Secondary School or a recognised Teacher Training course, and MUST POSSESS THE MINIMUM EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED BY THE INSTITUTION AT WHICH THE COURSE WILL BE TAKEN. In all cases awards will only be made if candidates of suitable character and educational attainments are forthcoming, and will be dependent on the acceptance of the successful candidates by an appropriate College or Institution. A medical examination, which will include a tuberculin test and X-ray examination of the chest, will also be necessary.

5. The majority of awards will be for courses now available either wholly or in part at Colleges in West Africa, namely:—

- University College, Ibadan, Nigeria;
- The Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology, Nigeria;
- The University College of Ghana;
- Fourah Bay College, Sierra Leone;
- Kumasi College of Technology, Ghana.

Intending candidates should acquaint themselves with the conditions for entry to these institutions AND MUST THEMSELVES apply direct for admission to the institution of their choice. Candidates will be required to provide evidence of acceptance but no guarantee of an award can be given to every applicant within the categories mentioned in paragraph 2 above, even if he has been successful in obtaining entry to one of the West African Colleges.

6. No restriction is placed on the type of course or qualifications which an applicant may seek, but applications are usually considered only for courses leading to degrees or to equivalent or fully recognised professional qualifications.

7. Applications by serving Federal Government junior officers for study leave awards should NOT be made under this Notice.

8. All awards will be made by His Excellency the Governor-General.
