WESTERN REGION MARKETING BOARD
1958 PALM KERNELS MARKETING SCHEME
MINIMUM PRODUCER PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Western Region Marketing Board Law (No. 10 of 1954), has fixed the prices set out in Column II of the Schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for palm kernels during 1958 at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in Column I.

2. The minimum prices are based as in previous years on the naked ex-scale port of shipment price less the appropriate cost of transport by the approved normal routes.

3. The amount of the middlemen's allowance under the 1958 palm kernels marketing scheme is £1-4s-6d per ton, and, as in previous years, the middlemen's allowance has been taken into account in calculating the minimum prices payable for unbagged and ungraded palm kernels at "First Schedule" buying stations. At these stations a sum of £1-4s-6d will be paid for each ton of bagged, graded and sealed palm kernels in addition to the minimum prices payable for unbagged and ungraded palm kernels.

PRODUCE SALES TAX

4. Under the provisions of the Sale of Produce (Taxation) (Western Region) Order in Council, 1953, made under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, all sales of palm kernels made in the Western Region to licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to Produce Sales Tax at the rate of £1 per ton.

5. For purposes of collection of this tax for which under the Sale of Produce (Taxation) Ordinance, 1953, the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of palm kernels made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region, the arrangements as set out in paragraph 6 are prescribed.

6. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for palm kernels in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in Column III of the Schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of the produce sales tax).

The Federal Government proposes to offer, subject to the provision of the necessary funds by the House of Representatives, bursaries, scholarships and State scholarships to become available in the years 1958 and 1959. Twenty State Scholarships will be awarded, ten tenable at the University College, Ibadan, and ten tenable at the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology. These scholarships will be awarded by His Excellency the Governor-General on the recommendation of the Principals of the Colleges.

2. Candidates in the following categories will be eligible to apply for scholarships and bursaries to be awarded by His Excellency the Governor-General on the advice of the Federal Scholarships Advisory Board:—

(i) Those born or permanently domiciled in the Federal Territory of Lagos and the Southern Cameroons;

(ii) Staff serving in Federal Departments and in branches of other departments or inter-territorial institutions for which the Federal Government is responsible;

(iii) Applicants born or domiciled anywhere within the Federation who wish to seek the requisite qualifications for ultimate appointment to the Federal Public Service in senior administrative, executive or professional grades of the Federal Service;

(iv) Existing staff of autonomous bodies for which the Federal Government is responsible, who are seeking training for administrative, executive or professional posts.

Candidates who are selected for awards under the above categories will be required to sign an undertaking to serve or to continue to serve as directed by the Federal Government on completion of their courses. Those selected under category (iv) will be required to continue to serve their present employers.

3. The Federal Government awards for the years 1958-59 will be closely geared to the staffing needs of the Government and first consideration will be given to applicants who appear most likely to fit in with those needs. Applications for the following courses will receive first consideration:—

(i) Honours Degree Courses in Arts or Science; B.A. (Hons.) in Mathematics or Classics or English or Geography or History; B.Sc. (Special) in Mathematics or Botany or Zoology or Physics or Chemistry or Geography.

(iii) General Degree Courses—B.A. (General), B.Sc. (General).

(iv) Other Professional Courses—In Engineering, A.M.I.E.E., A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I. Mech.E.; in Survey and Valuation, A.R.I.C.S.; in Architecture, A.R.I.B.A.; in Accountancy, A.C.C.A. and A.I.C.W.A.

(v) Miscellaneous Courses: Shipping Navigation Courses; Mate and Master Mariners' Certificate, Marine Engineers' Certificate.

(vi) Teacher Training Courses: Diploma in Education, Professional Teachers' Certificate.

4. Applications for scholarships and bursaries may be made by candidates of either sex, preference normally being given to those under 30 years of age. Candidates will be required to have completed a full Secondary School or a recognised Teacher Training course, and MUST POSSESS THE MINIMUM EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED BY THE INSTITUTION AT WHICH THE COURSE WILL BE TAKEN. In all cases awards will only be made if candidates of suitable character and educational attainments are forthcoming and, will be dependent on the acceptance of the successful candidates by an appropriate College or Institution.
