WHEREAS by the Nigeria (Offices of Governor-General and Governors) Orders in Council, 1954 to 1957 constituting the office of the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, the Governor-General may, by Instrument under the Public Seal of the Federation, authorise the Deputy Governor-General to discharge for and on behalf of the Governor-General on such occasions and subject to such exception and conditions as may be specified in that Instrument such of the functions of the office of Governor-General as may be specified in that Instrument :

AND WHEREAS I consider it desirable to authorise the Deputy Governor-General to exercise all the functions of the office of Governor-General on any occasion when I am absent from Lagos :

KNOW YE THEREFORE that I, JAMES WILSON ROBERTSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby appoint SIR RALPH FRANCIS ALNWICK GREY, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire on the occasions of and during any period that I shall cause my absence from Lagos to be notified in the Gazette of the Federation, to exercise and perform and execute on my behalf throughout Nigeria all functions by the said Orders in Council or otherwise howsoever vested in the Governor-General subject to the Instructions addressed to the said SIR RALPH FRANCIS ALNWICK GREY for his guidance.
