INFORMATION ON production trade, consumption and prices as regular, authoritative and up-to-date as possible, is constantly needed by all engaged in commerce and industry. It is also needed in government offices and by all those whose business it is to watch and record the trend of economic events whether in universities, research institutions, economic journals or elsewhere.

The Commonwealth Governments are represented, by issues of a number of publications on various aspects of Commonwealth production and trade related to the world background. These publications are as under.

THE INTELLIGENCE SERVICES

Separate periodical Intelligence Services issued by the Committee deal respectively with Dairy Produce and Meat, Fruit, Wool, Grain (including Rice) and Tobacco.

These publications provide regular, comprehensive and prompt information on the supply and distribution throughout the world of certain commodities of particular importance in Commonwealth trade. Regular features, which vary according to the commodity covered, include particulars of production, shipments afloat and exports from the chief sources of supply, imports into the United Kingdom and other importing countries, market quotations, stocks in store, legislative and other measures affecting production, trade, consumption and prices in the main countries concerned together with reports on crop prospects. Special articles included from time to time deal with the outlook and general trends in producing and consuming countries or with related commodities. The five Intelligence Services are as follows :

Intelligence Bulletin (Dairy Produce and Meat). Issued monthly, with weekly supplement entitled Weekly Dairy Produce Supplies includes periodical articles on related commodities, e.g., feeding stuffs, margarine and lard and regular information on eggs.

Fruit Intelligence.—Issued monthly, with weekly supplement entitled Weekly Fruit Supplies. Covers fresh, canned and dried fruit, fruit juices, fresh and processed vegetables and, in the weekly supplement, details of all fresh fruit cargoes destined to United Kingdom ports.

Weol Intelligence. Issued monthly. Covers also wool tops, yarns and piece goods and includes a monthly Fibres Supplement dealing with rayon and acetate once a quarter and with cotton in intervening months.

Grain Bulletin (including Rice Supplement). Issued monthly. Covers wheat and wheat flour, barley, oats, maize, rye and rice

Tobacco Intelligence. Issued quarterly, with supplement, entitled Tobacco Bulletin, in intervening months. Covers production and trade in leaf and also, United Kingdom trade in manufactured products.

THE COMMODITY SERIES

The Commodity Series, which is re-issued annually, is designed to present, in convenient form reviews of world production, international trade consumption and prices for groups of related commodities, with special reference to the Commonwealth; included also are Appendices on marketing policies and legislative, measures affecting supply and demand. The seven volumes in the series are as follows:

Dairy Produce : butter, cheese, condensed milk, milk powder, casein, eggs, egg products and margarine.

Meat : cattle, sheep, pigs, beef, mutton and ham, bacon and hams, pork, canned meat, offais and poultry meat.

Fruit : apples, pears, plums, cherries, peaches, spricots, bananas, citrus fruits, grapes, pineapples, fruit juices, dried tree fruits, raisins, currants, canned fruit and wine.

Industrial Fibres : cotton, wool, mohsir, silk, flax jute, coir, kapok, sisal and other hemps, rayon and, other man-made fibres.

Grain Crops ; wheat, wheat flour, barley, oats, maize, rye and rice.

Plantation Crops : sugar, tea, coffee, cocos, spices, tobacco and rubber.

Vegetable Oils and Olliceds : Cottonsood, linsood, rapaseod, scasme seed, sunflower seed, soya beans groundnuts, copra, coconut oil, palm ketnels, palm oil, olive oil, ous' ir seed, tung oil and some twenty miscellaneous oilsceds and vegetable oils.
