On arrival at the College each boy must deposit the sum of £3 with the Principal. This sum will be used to cover breakages and the loss of, or damage to School property. A separate account will be kept for each boy and any credit balance will be refunded to him at the end of his school career.

10. Eleven open Scholarships will be awarded at both Umuahia and Afikpo and Eight at Owerri. They will be awarded in order of merit, on the results of the first annual examination, not as previously on the results in the Entrance Examination. In addition a number of Regional Scholarships may be awarded to boys from backward areas who pass the Entrance Examination. The Scholarships, which cover Boarding and Tuition Fees only, will normally be tenable for the duration of the school career. They will, however, be subject to periodical review and, provided due warning has been given, may be withdrawn at any time on the grounds of bad conduct or bad work.

11. Admission will be to Class 1 only. ## THE COMMODITY SERIES

The Commodity Series, which is re-issued annually, is designed to present, in convenient form reviews of world production, international trade consumption and prices for groups of related commodities, with special reference to the Commonwealth; included also are Appendices on marketing policies and legislative measures affecting supply and demand. The seven volumes in the series are as follows:

*Dairy Produce* : butter, cheese, condensed milk, milk powder, casein, eggs, egg products and margarine.

*Meat* : cattle, sheep, pigs, beef, mutton and ham, bacon and hams, pork, canned meat, offals and poultry meat.

*Fruit* : apples, pears, plums, cherries, peaches, apricots, bananas, citrus fruits, grapes, pineapples, fruit juices, dried tree fruits, raisins, currants, canned fruit and wine.

*Industrial Fibres* : cotton, wool, mohair, silk, flax jute, coir, kapok, sisal and other hems, rayon and, other man-made fibres.

*Grain Crops* : wheat, wheat flour, barley, oats, maize, rye and rice.

*Plantation Crops* : sugar, tea, coffee, cocoa, spices, tobacco and rubber.

*Vegetable Oils and Oilseeds* : Cottonseed, linseed, rapeseed, sesame seed, sunflower seed, soya beans groundnuts, copra, coconut oil, palm kernels, palm oil, olive oil, castor seed, tung oil and some twenty miscellaneous oilseeds and vegetable oils.

## OTHER PUBLICATIONS

The Committee, since its inception in 1925, has issued a large number of reports, other than those comprised in the Intelligence Services and the Commodity Series. Since the war the Committee has published reports on Commonwealth Trade (1949) and Commonwealth Agriculture (1952) as well as more specialised surveys on Fertilisers and Agricultural Machinery. Later Memoranda on Commonwealth Trade (issued annually) and Commonwealth agriculture (1955) bring up to date the main facts given in the earlier reports, including those on Fertilisers and Agricultural Machinery. Other publications issued by the Committee in recent years include studies of wool production, consumption and trade, jute manufactures and canned food. An annual Report is published which gives details of the Committee's activities and a complete list of its publications. Among these are reports surveys and memoranda, issued from 1925 to 1939, dealing with a variety of commodities and industries such as Dairy Produce, Fish, Poultry and Eggs, Honey, Timber, Pigs and Pig Products, Tea, Coffee, Cocoa, Wine, Maize, Tobacco.
