IMPORTATION OF MOTOR CARS AND STATION WAGONS FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND CANADA DURING 1958

The need to conserve expenditure of hard currency still obtains and it is accordingly necessary, as in previous years, to control the quantity and distribution of saloon cars and station wagons imported from the United States of America and Canada. The control will continue to be exercised by means of "letters of authority to purchase" which will be issued by the appropriate Federal and Regional Authorities.

- 2. Recognised distributors of saloon cars and station wagons imported direct from the United States of America and Canada are permitted to sell these vehicles only to persons in possession of a valid letter of authority. Such letters will be issued only to persons who can adduce evidence for a special need for these vehicles.
- 3. Details will be published in the Regional Gravettes of the procedure to be followed by applicants in the Regions. Applications for permits to purchase from the Federal allocation may be submitted to the Director, Federal Department of Commerce and Industries, by persons in the following categories:—
  - (a) Heads of Government Departments and public corporations, in respect of their Lagos and Southern Cameroons official requirements;
  - (b) Federal Government officers, wherever

- (c) Heads of firms with headquarters in Lagos and branches in the Regions, in respect of the firm's overall requirements for Lagos and the Regions;
- (d) Individuals resident in Lagos, and the Southern Cameroons.
- 4. The following particulars are required with each application:—
  - (1) Name and address of applicant
  - (2) Nature of business/profession
  - (3) Details of any saloon car(s)/station wagon(s) at present owned, mileage already covered and date of first registration in Nigeria, in respect of each vehicle. In the case of firms owning two or more cars, details are also required of the person by whom each car is normally used.
    - (4) Mileage covered annually.
    - (5) Areas visited regularly.
- 5. Two categories of vehicles will be imported. The lower priced cars are listed in Category A and the higher priced cars in Category B hereunder. Permits to purchase vehicles in Category B will be issued only in exceptional circumstances and full reasons must be adduced as to why one of the Category A cars is unsuitable for the applicant.

- 6. In each category there may be certain models exceeding the permitted range of landed costs: licences to import such models will not normally be granted unless prior authority has been sought, and obtained, in each individual case.
- 7. Successful applicants for permits to purchase North American vehicles will no longer be required to enter into an undertaking not to sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle within two years of the date of delivery, but any person found to have disposed of a new American car, without good reason, within a few months of acquiring it, is unlikely to be successful in any further application for another American car.

AGRICULTURE

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for appointment as Principal of the School of Agriculture at Samaru in Zaria Province or as Principal of the school of Agriculture at Kabba (not yet completed).

Scale of salary.—Group 8—£1,500-60-1,620 plus inducement addition where applicable. Contract terms may be arranged, if desired for, from one to three tours.

Qualifications.—Candidates should be between 35 and 52 years of age and he graduates in Agriculture, or Agricultural Science, or Horticulture, of at least eight years standing and should be sound agriculturists or horticulturists. They should have had considerable teaching experience preferably of the Farm Institute type and have the standing of Senior Lecturers in a Farm Institute or its equivalent. Exparience of advisory or similar work amongst farmers would be considered an additional and desirable qualification. Work with young Farmers Clubs and experience in their organisation would also be useful. The man appointed would of necessity have to have a genuine interest in and liking for work with students and be prepared to encourage extra curricular activities through student clubs and societies.

Duties.—To take charge of one of the two Schools of Agriculture established by the Ministry of Agriculture at Samaru in Zaria Province, and at Kabba. These schools are designed to train Assistants for the Ministry of Agriculture of the Northern Region and will accommodate approximately 90 students each. The School at Samaru has been in operation for a number of years but that at Kabba is not yet complete. In addition to controlling the school the Principal may also be required to assist in establishing extramural classes in the area served by the School.

Other conditions of service.—In the case of a new entrant to Government Service on Pensionable terms, appointment will be on probation for three years.
