TO THE EXECUTIVE, CLERICAL AND SUB-CLERICAL
(i.e., CLERICAL ASSISTANT) CLASSES

I am directed to refer to Appendices III and IV of the Randell Report (reproduced as Annexure I to Circular A4/1957), and to inform you that the annual Limited Competitions for Promotion to the Sub-Clerical, Clerical and Executive Classes for officers serving in grades below are now scheduled to be held on the 14th and 15th November, 1958.

The following are the details of each of the proposed Competitions.

EXECUTIVE CLASS COMPETITIONS:

(a) *Conditions of entry.*—The only persons eligible to enter for the competitions are pensionable serving officers in the Federal or a Regional Public Service who

(i) will have at least five years pensionable service on the 16th November, 1958.

(ii) were born between the 16th November, 1923, and the 16th November, 1934.

(b) *Syllabus.*—See Annexure II to Circular A4/1957. This will remain largely unchanged but

(i) in the Arithmetic paper there will be a choice of two out of four questions in Section B.

(ii) time allowed for the Arithmetic paper will be increased to 2½ hours.

(iii) total marks for the Arithmetic paper will be increased to 150.

(iv) in the General paper only four questions need be answered out of a total of eight or nine.

(v) in the General paper only one or two questions will be compulsory.

(vi) it should be noted that more weight is attached to questions on the interpretation of graphs and statistical data, and items on the summarising of official documents and correspondence, than to the other items of the syllabus.

(c) *Specimen Papers.*—See Annexure III to Circular A4/1957 and amendments (i) to (vi) in the foregoing paragraph.

(d) *Method of entry.*—

(i) Candidates should forward their application forms (see Annexure IV to Circular A4/1957) further supplies of the form being obtainable by Departments from the Federal Government Printer, through the Head of their Departments, attaching to the application a Treasury receipt for £2, representing the entrance fee necessary to cover the cost per candidate of the examination; no refund of the entry fee will be made to candidates who withdraw.

(ii) Heads of Departments should complete (see Annexure IV to Circular A4/1957) the Form of Application and Report and forward it to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission.

(e) *Examination Centres.*—These will be established at the towns listed below, provided the number of candidates in each area is sufficient to justify this:

Jos, Kaduna, Kano, Zaria, Abe, Calabar, Enugu, Onitsha, Port Harcourt, Umuahia, Abokkuts, Akure, Benin City, Ibadan, Ijebu Ode, Ilorin, Warri, Lagos, Sasse, Bali.

No change of Centre will be permitted after entries have been submitted to the West African Examinations Council.

(f) *Travelling expenses.*—Candidates accepted for the examination will be treated for the purposes of travelling expenses and absence from their normal work as being on duty: those on leave will be similarly treated, except that no extra leave will be granted in compensation for the time spent on the examination.

(g) The following are the last dates for the acceptance of entries:

(i) by Heads of Departments from candidates: 15-7-58.

(ii) by the Public Service Commission from Departments: 15-8-58.

(iii) by the West African Examinations Council from the Public Service Commission: 15-9-58.

CLERICAL CLASS COMPETITION

(a) *Conditions of entry:*

(i) no age limit.

(ii) only officers serving in the Federal Public Service (including the Southern Cameroons) who will have at least three years service on the 16th of November, 1958, are eligible to enter.

(iii) G Scale officers will be eligible to take this examination.

(b) *Syllabus*.—See Annexure V to Circular A4/1957.

This will remain largely unchanged but

(i) the English paper will consist of an essay and a précis only.

(ii) the time allowed for the Arithmetic paper will be increased by $\frac{1}{2}$ hour to a total of two hours.

(c) *Specimen Papers*.—See Annexure VI to Circular A4/1957 and amendments (i) and (ii) in the foregoing paragraph.

(d) *Method of entry*.—As for the Executive Competition (see paragraph 3 (d) above).

(e) *Examination Centres*.—As for the Executive Class Competition (see paragraph 3 (e) above).

(f) *Travelling Expenses*.—As for the Executive Class Competition (see paragraph 3 (f) above).

(g) *Last dates for acceptance of entries*.—As for the Executive Class (see paragraph 3 (g) above).

SUB-CURRICULAR CLASS COMPETITION

(a) *Conditions of entry* :

(i) no age limit.

(ii) only officers serving in the Federal Public Service (including the Southern Cameroons) who will have at least three years' service on the 16th of November, 1958, are eligible to enter.

(iii) G Scale officers will be eligible to take this examination.

(b) *Syllabus* : This competition will be similar in standard to that required of candidates for entry to a secondary school. It will consist of three straightforward tests of the candidates' knowledge of English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge. The Arithmetic and General Knowledge papers will be $\frac{1}{2}$ hour papers, and the English paper will be a 1 hour paper. Each of the three papers will carry a maximum of 100 marks.

(c) *Specimen Papers* : Reference may be made to Annexure VI of Circular A4/1957. The Arithmetic and General papers will be similar in form and content to the specimen Arithmetic paper I and General paper I respectively; the English paper will be similar in standard to section A of the specimen English paper but may be different in form and content.

(d) *Method of entry* : As for the Executive Competition (See paragraph 3 (d) above).

(e) *Examination Centres* : As for the Executive Class Competition (See paragraph 3 (e) above).

(f) *Travelling Expenses* : As for the Executive Class Competition (See paragraph 3 (f) above).

(g) *Last dates for acceptance of entries* : As for the Executive Class (See paragraph 3 (g) above).

The Federal Officers to whom this Circular is addressed are requested to take the following action :

(a) to ensure that all eligible officers in their Departments including those on leave, are informed of the Circular's provisions and supplied with forms of application.

(b) to obtain from the Government Printer such additional supplies of forms as are required and to distribute them.

(c) to check, complete and forward applications to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, by the due dates. A schedule giving names, addresses, and preferred examination centre of all the candidates in the department should be forwarded to the Secretary, Federal Public Service Commission, in advance, to arrive not later than 1-8-58, so that preliminary arrangements can be made.
