THE FOREIGN COMPENSATION (HUNGARY)
ORDER, 1958

The above Order in Council, obtainable from H.M.S.O. (S.I. 1958. No. 594, price 7d), provides for the distribution of compensation payable by the Hungarian Government under the Anglo-Hungarian Agreement of the 27th of June, 1956 (Command 9820).

The Agreement provided for the payment to Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom by the Hungarian Government of the sum of £4,050,000 in full and final settlement of claims by British nationals: (a) in respect of British property, rights and interests affected by certain specified Hungarian measures of nationalisation, land reform, expropriation and State administration; (b) under Article 26 of the Treaty of Peace with Hungary; (c) in respect of certain pre-war debts and bank balances; and (d) in respect of shares in Hungarian banks affected by Hungarian Law Number XXX of December 1, 1947.

The compensation is payable by the Hungarian Government over a number of years in annual instalments and these will be distributed at suitable intervals.

The Order in Council empowers the Foreign Compensation Commission, 1, Princes Gate, London, S.W. 7., to receive applications to participate in the distribution of compensation, from individuals, corporations, firms or associations and to determine claims in accordance with the provisions of the Order.

Prospective applicants under the Order who have already registered claims with the Foreign Compensation Commission or whose claims under Article 26 of the Treaty of Peace with Hungary are notified to the Commission by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs should receive an application form from the Commission and need take no action unless the form fails to reach them within thirty days. Others should write to the Commission as soon as possible.

Applications under the Order must reach the Foreign Compensation Commission on or before the 14th of October, 1958.

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS—INVOICES

This Notice cancels and replaces Government Notice No. 794 published in the *Official Gazette* dated 8th May, 1958.

Note :

In this Notice :—

an "overseas buying agent" includes a commission agent, a confirming house or any person or firm who executes orders on another person or firm overseas on behalf of an importer in Nigeria and includes persons employed by or in any way associated with the importer in Nigeria ;

an "exporter" means a person or firm consigning the goods to the importer in Nigeria ;

a "supplier" means the person or firm who supplies the goods to the foreign exporter (the term "supplier" is normally used in connection with raw materials which have not been processed or manufactured) ;

a "manufacturer" means the person or firm who actually manufactured the goods ;

an "approved overseas Bank or Chamber of Commerce" means any such Bank or Chamber of Commerce or like body approved for this purpose by the Minister of Finance : lists setting out the names of approved overseas Banks or Chambers of Commerce will be published from time to time in the *Gazette*. Requests for approval for this purpose of the names of such Banks or Chambers of Commerce should be forwarded as soon as possible to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance.

Associated Firms :—Importers and overseas exporters are deemed to be associated if, whether directly or indirectly, either of them has any interest in the business or property of the other or both have a common interest in any business or property, or some third person has any interest in the business or property or both of them, and includes cases where :—

(a) they are under common management ;

(b) one is a branch of the other ;

(c) one is a subsidiary of the other ;

(d) one is an overseas buying agent of the other ;

(e) one or more directors are common to both ;

(f) the owners of the two businesses are members of the same family.

1. As from Wednesday, 1st October, 1958, the following documents must be presented at Customs Houses in support of each entry for trade goods imported by sea or air :

(a) For trade goods liable to *ad valorem* duty imported from any country except the United Kingdom—two sets of each invoice necessary to trace the transaction back to the actual manufacturer of the goods ;

(b) For trade goods liable to *ad valorem* duty imported from the United Kingdom by a person or firm associated with the exporter—two sets of invoices from the suppliers or manufacturers of the goods ;

(c) In addition to the foregoing for all trade goods irrespective of the country of exportation and whether or not liable to duty, two sets of invoices from the exporter, accompanied, as

hitherto, by the normal Certificate of Origin and Value (i.e., 'attested' invoices), must be produced.

2. Each set of original invoices must be attached to the original Bill of Entry, and duplicate sets to the second copy of the entry. Each duplicate set must, of course, be an exact copy of the original and great care must be exercised to ensure that each set is complete and separate, otherwise entries may be rejected.

3. All the above enumerated copies of invoices will be retained by the Comptroller. They will, in no circumstances, be returned to the importer or his agent.

4. The requirements set out in paragraphs 1 (a) and (b) of this notice, will be deemed to have been satisfied if the invoices presented in accordance with paragraph 1 (c) bear a certificate by an approved overseas Bank or Chamber of Commerce stating that they have inspected original documents relating to the goods from the manufacturers and/or suppliers and have found them to support the particulars given in the invoices now certified. Any further relaxation of the requirements of paragraphs 1(a) and (b) will only be given in very exceptional circumstances and then only by an officer not below the rank of Assistant Comptroller, or, in the case of the Delta Ports, Victoria and Tiko, a Principal Collector.
