## GOVERNMENT OF INDIA CULTURAL SCHOLARSHIPS SCHEME, 1959-60

To promote cultural relations between India and Nigeria, the Government of India propose to award five scholarships to candidates from Nigeria, excluding the Trust Territory of Cameroons, candidates from which should apply to the Government of India through the Secretary-General, United Nations, New York, during the academic year, 1959-60.

- 2. The value of the scholarship is £15 per month (equivalent to Rs. 200/0 (Indian). This is exclusive of capitation, tuition and examinations fees which will be paid by the Government of India direct to the Institutions concerned. Other facilities that are granted include medical expenses, cost of study tours arranged by the Institution where a scholar studies, expenses on holiday or Youth Welfare Camp, study of Hindi, Book allowance, vacation grant, and emergency grant. The cost of passages to and from India, and the cost of private journeys within India will, however, have to be met by the scholars themselves.
- 3. Except in the cases of candidates possessing Degree qualifications and applying for Post Graduate courses, the age of a candidate should not normally exceed 25 years.
- 4. The courses will commence in June-July, 1959. Scholarships are awarded for studies in Arts and Humanities, Sciences, Agriculture, Medicine, Technology, Education, Law, Commerce, Forestry, Veterinary Science, Engineering, Diploma courses for Engineering and Technical subjects, African studies, Journalism, etc. Preference will be given

to candidates desiring to take up post-graduate courses. Doctors doing private practice and wishing to come to India for post-graduate studies may also be considered for the award of these scholarships.

- 5. Minimum qualifications required are :-
  - (a) Senior Cambridge Certificate.
  - (b) The Higher Cambridge Examination.
  - (c) The London Matriculation Examination.
- (d) The General Certificate of Education (Advanced Level).

For professional and technical courses, the above may not suffice; candidates must state their qualifications in full at the time of applying.
