- (d) importation in containers showing the formula used, and holdly labelled "Medicated dusting powder".

H.M. CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS

To ensure compliance with Government Notice No. 1467 published in Official Gazette No. 56 dated 7th August, 1958, importers of goods from the United Kingdom are hereby informed that all entries submitted on or after 1st October, 1958 in respect of imported trade goods liable to duty ad calorem, must bear the following declaration.

"I declare that the suppliers and importer of the goods entered hereon are not associated firms as defined in Federal Government Notice No. 1467 of 1958."

With effect from Wednesday, 1st October, 1958; all invoices presented with entries for imported goods, other than transit, transhipment, ex-warehouse removal and ex-warehouse export entries, must account for the full c.i.f. price paid, or to be paid, for the goods. Alternatively, where the invoices for particular goods do not show such details, such additional documents must be presented with them as well, together with the invoices, account for the full c.i.f. cost.

The documents must cover such items as buying commissions, head office commissions, confirming house charges, etc., notwithstanding the fact that it may be claimed that these charges are allowable as deductions from the s.i.f. value in order to arrive at the value for duty purposes.

The sole exception to this rule is that documents need not be presented in respect of bank or other agency charges on account of the negotiation of bills of exchange or of the collection of money and the transfer thereof from Nigeria to another country.
