

AUSTRIA

RESTORATION OF LIFE
ASSURANCE POLICIES

A new Law (Federal Law concerning the settlement of claims arising from life assurance policies confiscated by the German Reich) was passed by the Austrian Parliament on the 26th of June, 1958, designed to restore the right to claim benefits from life assurance policies which were confiscated by the German Reich during the National-Socialist regime. As a result of this measure, which came into effect on the 8th of July, 1958—one day after its publication in the *Austrian Official Gazette*—the former holders of such policies will be treated in the same way as if their policies had never been confiscated. Persons who consider themselves entitled should file their claims with the appropriate Austrian insurance company not later than the 30th of June, 1959.

If in doubt claimants are advised to consult a lawyer practising in Austrian Law.

AUSTRIA

COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OF
HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND TOOLS OF
TRADE AS A RESULT OF THE WAR OR
POLITICAL PERSECUTION

Individuals who suffered property damage because of seizure, loss or destruction of household goods or tools of trade, within the Austrian Federal Territory,

(a) directly through war events or through acts of the Armed Forces of the Allied and Associated Powers during the period between September 1, 1939 and September 11, 1945,

or
(b) through measures of political persecution (Article 26 paragraph 1 of the State Treaty (BG B 1 No. 152/55) and section 1 paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Welfare Victims Law, BG B 1 No. 183/47 as amended by Law No. 77/57)) during the period between March 6, 1933 and May 8, 1945,

may be granted compensation in accordance with the provisions of Federal Law No. 127 of the Austrian Federal Republic dated 25th of June, 1958 (War and Persecution: Property Damage Law).

Claims for compensation under this law should be lodged with the Finanzlandesdirektion, in whose area of jurisdiction the seized, lost, or destroyed property was located at the time the damage occurred, before the 30th of June, 1959. Claims not so filed will be extinguished at that date.
