#### RENEWAL OF CONTRACT APPOINTMENTS

F.P.S.C. Circular No. FC.1017 of the 7th of May, 1958 F.E.S. Circular No. FC.1017/17 of the 1st of July, 1958 F.P.S.C. Circular No. FC.1017 of the 30th of July, 1958

I am directed to refer to the above Circulars which experience has shown to be cumbersome in channels of procedure and liable to lead to delays and to inform you that a new Circular No. FC.1017 of the 29th of November, 1958, in which such routine work is decentralized to those Departments or Ministries concerned, has come into force forthwith.

2. The following are the details of procedure embodied in the Circular :-

- (i) A contract officer who wishes his contract appointment to be renewed must inform his Head of Department accordingly four months before he is due to leave Nigeria on the termination of his residential service under his existing contract.
- (ii) the Head of Department (instead of writing to the Federal Establishment Secretary or to the Federal Public Service Commission) will
  - (a) write to the Ministry of Education asking for details of trainees (the Head of Department may not be aware of all of the relevant trainees).
  - (b) forward these details with the details of his staff position and Form No. Sect. 224 in draft to the Nigerianisation Officer for his comments. These details should show a precise analysis of:—

strength in the post/grade
vacancies in the post/grade
proportion of Nigerian to overseas officers
remiters of Nigerians-in-training.

- (iii) On receipt of the Nigerianisation Officer's comments the Head of Department will refer the whole case to this Commission for decision, attaching:—
  - (a) Form No. Sect. 224 in duplicate
  - (b) his comments on the application
  - (c) an up-to-date confidential report (unless such report has been forwarded within the previous two months); if a case is in any way complicated by divergence of views between the Head of Department, the Nigerianisation Officer or the Ministry of Education, the relevant correspondence will be copied to the Commission, together with the views of the Ministry concerned.
- (iv) The decision of the Commission will be conveyed to the Head of Department and copied (with one copy of Sect-224) to the Federal Establishment Secretary who will not be interested before this stage.
- 3. Further to paragraph 2 (iii) (a) above, it is particularly important that Heads of Departments ensure that Form No. Sect 224 is completed fully and without deficiency and that it contains all relevant information required by the Nigerianisation Officer and the Federal Public Service Commission in order to assess the situation.
  - 4. Finally, Heads of Departments are asked to
  - (a) bring this Circular to the notice of all their officers concerned and
  - (b) bear in mind that, in future, failure to take action as above and to ensure that the case is presented to the Federal Public Service Commission in good time before the departure of the officer may result in the contract not being renewed.
- 5. In respect of Renewal of Contract Appointments, this Circular cancels the F.P.S.C. Circular No. FC 1017 of 7th May, 1958; F.E.S. Circular No. FC.1017/17 of 1st July, 1958; and F.P.S.C. Circular No. FC.1017 of 30th July, 1958.
- 6. A separate Circular will be issued shortly regarding the procedure to be observed when submitting indents.
