By His Excellency Sin James Wilson Rosserson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

#### I. W. ROBERTSON. Governor-General

WHEREAS by the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, provision is made, among other things, for the constitution and powers of a House of Representatives for the Federation of Nigeria;

AND WHEREAS by section 82 of the said Order in Council it is further provided that the Governor-General may at any time by Proclamation prorogue the said House of Representatives :

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the sixth day of January, 1958, the fourth session of the said House of Representatives was appointed to commence on the eighteenth day of February, 1958:

And whereas it is desirable that the said House of Representatives should be prorogued:

Now, THEREFORE, I, the said James Wilson Robertson, Governor-General as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said House of Representatives with effect from the fifteenth day of January, 1959.

# PROCLAMATION AS TO THE FIFTH SESSION OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

By His Recellency Sir James Wilson Rosertson, Knight Grand Gross of the Most-Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Faderation of Nigeria.

#### J. W. ROBERTSON. Governor-General

WHEREAS by the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, provision is made, among other things, for the constitution and powers of a House of Representatives for the Federation of Nigeria:

AND WHEREAS by section 80 of the said Order it is provided that the sessions of the House of Representatives shall be held in such places and shall begin at such times as the Governor-General may, from time to time, by Proclamation appoint:

Now, THEREFORE, I, the said James Wilson Robertson, Governor-General as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation appoint the Chamber of the House of Representatives at Lagos and Thursday the 5th day of February, 1959, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to be the place and time of the commencement of the fifth tession of the said House of Representatives.

# De-Street Lighting Rate

As for B Commercial and Industrial Rate above but in addition in the event of the Street Lighting Fittings being the property of the Lighting Authority, and the Lighting Authority wishing the Corporation to maintain its street lighting system, a monthly charge per lamp, sufficient to cover the Corporation for routine inspection, cleaning and painting of fittings standards and brackets, lamp replacements, maintenance of control equipment and general maintenance of the public lighting system.
