THE COLONIAL SPECIAL CONSTABULARY MEDAL

ELIZABETH R.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Her Other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greetings!

WHEREAS We are desirous of honouring those who in Our Colonies and Territories under Our Protection or Administration have rendered long and meritorious Service as members of the Special Constabulary, sometimes called the Volunteer or Auxiliary Special Constabulary Reserve, or Special Reserve Police.

We do by these Presents for Us, our Heirs and Successors, institute and create a new Medal and We do hereby direct that it shall be governed by the following rules and ordinances:

First: Style.—The Medal shall be designated and styled "The Colonial Special Constabulary Medal".

Secondly: Description.—The Award shall be in silver, in the form of a circular Medal, bearing on the obverse the Crowned Effigy of the Sovereign, and on the reverse an emblematic design and the words "Colonial Special Constabulary. For Faithful Service".

Thirdly: Name of recipient.—The name and rank of the recipient and the Territory in which he completed his qualifying service shall be inscribed on the rim of the Medal.

Fourthly: Ribbon.—The Medal shall be worn on the left side attached by means of a suspending bar to a ribbon one inch and three-eighths in width, the central part green, with two borders, dark blue and each three-eighths of an inch in width, two silver stripes one-sixteenth of an inch in width being superimposed on the green central part, dividing it into three stripes of equal width.

Fifthly: Eligibility and Service required.—The Medal shall be awarded only to such members of any rank of the Special Constabulary Forces in Our Colonies and Territories under Our Protection or Administration, who satisfy the following conditions, namely:

(1) shall have served as a Special Constable without pay for not less than nine years in such Force or for periods amounting in the aggregate to not less than nine years in one or more such Forces, and shall be recommended by the Head of the Police Force as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed without pay such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him by the Head of the Police Force during that period or those periods; or

(2) shall have served as a Special Constable in receipt of remuneration for his service by way of salary or allowance, or training or retaining fees, for a period of not less than fifteen years in such Force or for periods amounting in the aggregate to not less than fifteen years in one or more such Forces, and shall be recommended by the Head of the Police Force as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him by the Head of the Police Force during that period or those periods:

Provided—

(a) that such service shall not be reckoned as qualifying service for the Colonial Police Long Service Medal.

(b) that no period shall be reckoned as qualifying service during which a member has been paid as a member of the permanent staff of such Force.

Sixthly : Clasp.—A Clasp to the Medal, to be attached to the ribbon when the Medal itself is worn, may be awarded on completion of each ten years of qualifying service as aforesaid after completion of qualifying service for the Medal. A small silver rose emblem denoting the award of each Clasp shall be worn on the ribbon when the ribbon only is worn.

Seventhly : Certificate of efficiency.—No person shall be recommended for the Medal or Clasp unless, having completed the qualifying period of service, it is certified that he was willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable, and performed such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him. It is also a requirement that the candidate shall have been put forward by the Officer in charge of the Special Constabulary in the Colony or Territory under Our Protection or Administration in which the period of service requisite to qualify for the Medal has been completed.

Eighthly : Order of wear.—In the official list showing the order in which Orders, Decorations and Medals should be worn the Colonial Special Constabulary Medal shall be placed immediately after the South African Medal for War Services.

Ninthly : Miniatures.—Reproductions of the Medal, known as miniature Medals, which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Medal is awarded, shall be approximately half the size of the Colonial Special Constabulary Medal, and a sealed pattern of the miniature Medal shall be kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Tenthly : Delegated powers.—Delegated powers to make awards under the terms of this Our Warrant shall be vested in Our Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government of the Colony or Territory in which the period of service requisite to qualify for the Medal has been completed.

Eleventhly : Other Awards.—It shall be a condition of the award of the Medal in the Special Constabulary in any Colony or Territory under Our Protection or Administration that the grant of any unofficial or local long service medals for wear in such Special Constabulary shall be discontinued, and that any unofficial or local long service medal already granted shall not be worn by a recipient of our Colonial Special Constabulary Medal.

Twelfthly : Forfeiture and restoration.—It shall be competent for Our Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government of any Colony or Territory under Our Protection or Administration, in relation to the Special Constabulary within his jurisdiction, to cancel and annul the conferment of the Medal on any person and also to restore a Medal which has been so forfeited.

Thirteenthly : Regulations.—Our Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government of the Colony or Territory concerned may, with the approval of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, make Regulations for the carrying out of the provisions of this Our Warrant providing for the manner of the application of this Our Warrant to the Special Constabulary Forces in Our Colonies or Territories under Our Protection or Administration, and the procedure to be followed regarding the recommendations for the award of the Medal, its forfeiture and restoration.

Lastly : Annulment, etc., of rules and ordinances.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE COLONIAL SPECIAL CONSTABULARY MEDAL.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Royal Warrant dated the 1st April, 1957, the Governor-General, with the approval of the Secretary of State, has made the following regulations governing the granting, forfeiture, restoration and other matters concerning the Colonial Special Constabulary Medal.

The Colonial Special Constabulary Medal and its Clasp will be granted in accordance with the provisions of the Royal Warrant as a reward for long and meritorious service to a member of the Nigeria Special Constabulary who on or after the 1st April, 1957, has served continuously without remuneration for his services as a Special Constable in any rank for not less than nine years in the Nigeria Special Constabulary or for periods amounting in the aggregate to not less than nine years in that and any other Special Constabulary Force to which the Royal Warrant has been applied:

Provided

(i) that no period of service as a whole time member of the permanent staff of such Force or Forces shall count as qualifying service;

(ii) that he has been recommended by the Inspector-General of Police as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed such duty as a Special Constable as required of him during the qualifying period of service;

(iii) where service has been rendered in the Special Constabulary Forces of more than one Colonial Territory as aforesaid, an interval not exceeding twelve months between any two periods of service shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of such service; and

(iv) a break in service not exceeding six calendar months in any one such Special Constabulary Force shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of service.

2. A Clasp will also be granted to a recipient of the Medal on his completing each further ten years qualifying service subsequent to the date of completion of the first nine years aforesaid. For each Clasp so awarded a small silver rose emblem may be added to the ribbon when worn alone.

3. Recommendations for the award of the Medal shall be submitted annually, in the month of April, by the Inspector-General of Police to the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government. The Medal shall be awarded on the authority of the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government and a notification of such award shall be published in the *Official Gazette* of the Federation.

4. A recipient of the Medal or Clasp who is convicted of a criminal offence, or is dismissed or removed from the Nigeria Special Constabulary for misconduct shall forfeit the Medal and Clasp unless the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government shall otherwise direct. A Medal or Clasp so forfeited may be restored to the recipient by the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government at his discretion.

5. A notice of forfeiture or restoration shall in every case be published in the *Official Gazette* of the Federation.

6. Where it appears to the Inspector-General of Police that a person to whom the Medal has been granted whilst in the Nigeria Police has lost the same the Inspector-General shall cause enquiry to be made as to whether the loss

(a) Occurred when such person was on duty and from causes beyond his control; or

(b) was due to accident; or

(c) was occasioned wilfully;

In cases (a) and (b) the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government may grant a new Medal. In case (a) the grant may be made at the public expense. In case (b) the cost of the new Medal must be borne by the recipient. In case (c) the report of such enquiry, together with the recommendations of the Inspector-General of Police shall be submitted to the Governor-General or Officer Administering the Government who may order replacement of the Medal, subject to such conditions as to payment or otherwise as he may think fit.

7. Where an application for the grant of a new Medal is made by a person after he has ceased to be a member of the Nigeria Special Constabulary, a new Medal will only be granted after the applicant has established that the loss occurred from causes beyond his control.

8. New Medals will not be issued until a period of six months has elapsed from the date of the loss.

(b) APPOINTMENTS TO THE EXECUTIVE GRADE

Applications are invited from suitably qualified Nigerians in respect of the undermentioned training courses and vacancies in the Public Service of the Northern Regional Government:—

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE TRAINING COURSE, 1959-60

(Open to candidates of Northern origin only)

(a) Normally, candidates for the Administrative Service are required to hold a University Degree. As a temporary measure, however, consideration will be given to candidates who hold the West African School Certificate or an equivalent pass in the G.C.E., that is, G.C.E. with six passes at ordinary level,

(b) In exceptional cases consideration will be given to candidates holding lower educational qualifications who, since leaving school, have acquired additional professional qualifications.

Those who have a qualification lower than the West African School Certificate or its equivalent will be required to sit a written examination before or after being called for interviews.

All candidates should be able to show evidence of ability, energy, integrity, responsibility, adaptability, initiative and a high standard of English.

Candidates must be certified as physically fit and be over 22 years and under 30 years of age on 1st August, 1959.

Those selected will undertake a course at the Institute of Administration, Zaria, lasting approximately eleven months. Instruction will be given in English, Law, Local Government, Finance and in a number of subsidiary subjects. There will be practical work in a variety of subjects and six weeks of the course will be spent on attachment to a Division. Students will also be expected to take part in games and in the extra-mural activities of the Institute. A Man O'War Bay Training Course, designed for training in leadership and physical endurance, will be held early in the course and there will be examinations during the course as well as at the end of the course. In order to pass the course students must obtain a satisfactory report on the terminal and final examinations taken into consideration with their conduct and work on the course as a whole, including a satisfactory report on the Man O'War Bay Training Course.

If at any time during the course it becomes apparent that the student will not be able to reach the required standard, he will be so informed by the Public Service Commission and consideration will be given for alternative employment according to his qualifications, if he so desires it.

The attainment of a Class A Pass on the successful completion of the course will render a student eligible for appointment as an Administrative Officer in the Salary Scale A.1 (£624-1,380); students who obtain a Class B Pass will be eligible for appointment in the Executive Grade.

Administrative arrangements.—During the period of the course students not already in Government or N.A. Service will receive an allowance of £25 per month; Government or N.A. officials will be treated as being on leave without pay, but will receive allowances at the rate of their substantive salaries or £25 per month, whichever is the greater. Accommodation will be provided at the Institute for candidates and their families. No charge will be made for rent, but students will be expected to pay for their own food and for electricity and water rates.

2. APPOINTMENTS TO THE EXECUTIVE GRADE.

Salary scale.—(C)E Training 1, 2—£270-294-318; £390-18-444, £468, £492; £540-24-588, £660, £684, £714.

Previous experience may also be taken into consideration when determining the commencing salary on first appointment as an Assistant Executive Officer-in-Training.

Qualifications.—Candidates for direct entry to the Executive Grade must be of Northern origin and are normally required to hold a minimum educational qualification of School Certificate or G.C.E. with six passes at Ordinary Level. This qualification is a pre-requisite for candidates applying for entry direct from Secondary Schools or other training institutions. Candidates for direct entry should not be above the age of 24 on the 31st March, 1959. Candidates awaiting the result of their School Certificate examination may apply.

Northern and non-Northern candidates from either Government or Native Authority Service whose basic educational qualifications are less than the above but who have also given proof of integrity, ability, energy, responsibility and adaptability in their employment since leaving school, will be considered provided they have attained at least the grade of Second Class Clerk or its equivalent.

Candidates must be physically fit.

Duties.—The duties of the office include the application of establishment Government policy and work connected with individual cases where judgment and discretion are needed. In some instances, Assistant Executive Officers may be required to specialise in specific subjects, e.g., Establishment matters, Accounting Procedure, Office Management, etc.

Training.—Successful candidate will normally be required to undergo a course of one year's duration at the Technical Institute and Trade Centre, Kaduna, in general education in English, Economics, Local Government and in Government Procedures and Regulations. On successful completion of the course direct entrants will remain on probation in the Training Grade for a further 2 years, and thereafter they will be considered for substantive appointment as Assistant Executive Officers, while those already in Government Service may be considered for promotion to the post of Assistant Executive Officer at any time after successful completion of the course. Candidates from Native Authorities will be considered also on the same basis as those from Government. It is hoped that this course will begin towards the end of 1959.

Other conditions of service.—During the training period, students will be subject to Government rules and regulations. They will be posted to work in Ministries for a period from June to September during which time the Technical Institute and Trade Centre is on long vacation. This practical course forms part of the training period.

After appointment candidates may be required to serve anywhere in the Northern Region and the Northern Cameroons.

Direct entrants would be required to live in the College Hostel and will be required to pay £25 per annum for their board and lodging.

Candidates while in training will be treated as students of the Institute and will be required to comply with the instructions of the Principal. They will be required to wear uniform during school hours; uniform may be bought at cost price from the Institute.

Married students accompanied by their wives will be responsible for finding their own accommodation in Kaduna while attending the course.

Students will not normally be permitted to take leave during the course, apart from the short Christmas vacation and normal Public Holidays.

Method of application.—All applications, which should be completed on Form PSC (NR) 1, should be addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, so as to reach him not later than the 31st March, 1959.

Candidates whose qualifications appear to reach the required standard may be called for one or more interviews in Kaduna.

Applicants in N.A. Service should forward their applications through their Native Authority and the Resident, requesting both parties to attach confidential reports. Applicants in Government Service should forward their application through their Resident or Permanent Secretary, as the case may be, who should attach a confidential report. Applicants in neither Government nor N.A. Service should forward their applications through their employers, asking them to attach a report. It is essential that every applicant should give a complete and detailed account of all employment since leaving school.

Duplicate copies of applications may be forwarded direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, for information. The Secretary, Public Service Commission, may request each of the three referees nominated by candidates for a confidential report on the applicant, and may require also a report to cover a candidate's employment since leaving school.

Applications should be completed in duplicate on forms PSC (NR) 1 and 1A, which may be obtained from all Residents in charge of Provinces, from the Federal or Regional Information Service, or direct from the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna.
