In 1955, the Antiquities Commission decided to institute a Nigerian Antiquities Fund with the primary object of enabling the Commission to act swiftly and effectively whenever antiquities of vital importance to Nigeria's art collections are offered for sale, whether in Nigeria or abroad, at very short notice. In addition to opening the fund to contributions, the Commission also put into effect a scheme for the manufacture and sale of post-cards, with a view both to making modest profits for the Fund and at the same time achieving publicity for the objects of the Fund.
- 3. A statement of Account of the Fund as at 31st March, 1957 has now been prepared and is appended hereto.

If at any time during the course it becomes apparent that the student will not be able to reach the required standard, he will be so informed by the Public Service Commission and consideration will be given for alternative employment according to his qualifications, if he so desires it.

The attainment of a Class A Pass on the successful completion of the course will render a student eligible, for appointment as att Administrative Officer in the Salary Scale A.1 (£624-1,380); atudents who obtain a Class B Pass will be eligible for appointment in the Executive Grade.
