FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AFRICAN STAFF HOUSING  
SCHEME REGULATIONS

(This Notice amends Government Notice No. 850 published in the Federation Gazette No. 25 of the 16th May, 1957).

1. The management and general control of the Federal Government Housing Scheme for African Staff shall be vested in a Board of Management which shall be appointed by the Governor-General.

Board of Management

## 2. In these Regulations—

"the Board" means the Board of Management of the Federal Government African Staff Housing Scheme.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board.

"Chief Engineer" means the Chief Engineer, Federal Public Works Department, Lagos, and includes any other officer of the Public Works Department deputed by the Chief Engineer.

"Clear title" means the best title obtainable in any particular case and includes a title which in the opinion of the Board is good and reasonable security for a loan under these Regulations.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board.

"approved Building Contractor" means a building contractor whose name appears on the list of contractors compiled by the Federal Registration Board.

Interpretation.

3. Subject to the conditions set out in these Regulations the Board shall consider applications for advances for the purpose of

Objects of Scheme.

(i) building a house in the Federal Territory of Lagos for the residential use of the applicant or of his family; or

(ii) purchasing a parcel of land within the Federal Territory of Lagos on which to build a house for the residential use of the applicant or of his family; or

(iii) purchasing a house in the Federal Territory of Lagos for the residential use of the applicant or of his family; or

(iv) improving or extending a dwelling house owned by the applicant which is erected on land within the Federal Territory of Lagos to which the applicant has a clear title and in which the applicant or his family then reside; or

(v) purchasing the reversionary interest or title to land within the Federal Territory of Lagos upon which is erected the dwelling house in which the applicant or his family then reside.

## 4. Every applicant must satisfy the Board—

(i) that he is ordinarily resident within the Federal Territory of Lagos or, if not so resident, that he has members of his family ordinarily resident within the Federal Territory of Lagos for whose residence he wishes to build a house; and

(ii) that he has been confirmed in the service of the Federal Government of Nigeria, and

(iii) that he either holds a pensionable appointment or is a contributor to a provident fund; and

(iv) that he is in receipt of a salary of not less than £150 per annum; and

(v) that he is not more than fifty-two years of age.

Officers eligible for advances.

5. (1) An application on the approved form (Appendix I) must be addressed through the Applicant's Head of Department to the Secretary, Financial Secretary's Office, Lagos.

(2) The Secretary shall submit all applications received to the Board for consideration.

Method of application for advances.

(3) The Board may require an applicant to attend before them in person and give any further information that may be required concerning his application and his financial position.

6. Each application for an advance under these Regulations shall be considered by the Board on its merits. The approval or rejection of such application shall be at the absolute discretion of the Board and approval may be given subject to such terms and conditions as the Board may require.

Approval at discretion of Board.

Amounts of  
advances.

7. (1) Advances if granted shall not exceed the following maxima :—

(i) to build or improve a house—five years' salary of the applicant ;

(ii) to purchase land or reversionary interest therein—one year's salary of the applicant or the value of the land as assessed by the Chief Federal Land Officer, whichever is the lesser ;

(iii) to purchase a house—five years' salary of the applicant or the value of the house as assessed by the Chief Engineer, whichever is the lesser.

(2) In the case of applicants of thirty-eight years of age or over, an advance if granted shall be further limited to an amount which the applicant is prepared and, in the opinion of the Board, is in a position to refund in instalments equated to the number of years by which his age, at the date the advance is approved, falls short of fifty-four years.

(3) In the case of an applicant desiring to build or to improve or extend a house at a total cost in excess of the amount of the advance for which he qualifies under these Regulations an advance shall only be granted if, before any contract in respect of the work is signed, he deposits with the Accountant-General of the Federation a sum equal to the difference between the total cost of the work and the amount of the advance for which he qualifies.

(4) In the case of an applicant for an advance to purchase a house the sum advanced may, if the Chief Engineer so recommends, include such sum as is required to cover the cost of making good dilapidations therein subject always to a maximum advance of five years' salary of the applicant.

(5) An applicant who has been granted an advance to purchase land may be granted a further advance to build a house thereon provided that the maximum advance outstanding at any one time shall not exceed five years' salary of the applicant.

8. The Board shall be satisfied that an applicant for an advance to build a house has a clear title to the land on which the house is to be built and that the site is suitable in size, situation, healthiness and value.

9. (1) Lists of approved architects shall be kept in the office of the Secretary and shall be made available for the inspection of applicants. The Board shall have the right to add to this list or to remove therefrom the names of Architects at its absolute discretion.

(2) Plans and specifications required by these Regulations to be submitted to the Board must be prepared by an approved architect.

(3) Tenders for the construction or improvement or extension of houses will only be considered by the Board if submitted by an approved building contractor.

Advances to  
be used on  
erection, etc.  
of house.

10. (1) The advance granted to an applicant for the purpose of building, improving or extending a house may only be expended on the erection, improvement or extension of the house in accordance with plans and specifications which shall have been submitted to and have received the approval of the Board and which in addition shall comply with the various requirements of the Lagos Town Council and the Lagos Executive Development Board.

(2) Until the advance shall have been fully repaid no such plans shall be amended by the applicant without the prior permission of the Board.

Tenders.

11. (1) An applicant for an advance for the purpose of building, improving or extending a house, or the Board at the request of such an applicant, shall obtain tenders from at least three approved building contractors. The Board shall review the tenders so submitted and enter into a contract with the successful tenderer. The contract shall be signed by the Chairman on behalf of the Government of the Federation.

(2) Tender forms and specifications shall be supplied by the Secretary upon production to him by an approved building contractor of a Treasury receipt showing that the deposit prescribed hereunder has been paid by the contractor to the Accountant-General of the Federation.

(3) In the event of the rejection by the Board of a tender the amount deposited shall be refunded forthwith by the Secretary to the unsuccessful tenderer. In the event of the acceptance by the Board of a tender the amount deposited shall not be refunded to the contractor until he has fulfilled his contract. In the event that a tenderer withdraws his tender before the contract has been awarded by the Board he shall forfeit to the Board the amount of his deposit.

Insurance.

12. (1) At the request of the Board the Chief Engineer shall inspect the work of the building Contractor both during construction and during the maintenance period.

(2) Payment will be made to contractors from time to time upon the basis of certificates prepared by the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, Lagos. Payment will be made at the rate of 90 per cent of the value of the work certified by the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, Lagos, as having been executed and fixed in position. The remaining 10 per cent will be paid in the following manner :—

(i) 5 per cent upon the issue of a certificate of satisfactory completion of the contract by the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, Lagos ;

(ii) 5 per cent upon the issue of a further certificate by the Chief Engineer, Public Works Department, Lagos, certifying that no defects have been revealed in the work carried out under the contract. This further certificate will not be issued until after expiration of a period which must not be shorter than six months after issue of the completion certificate, as at clause 12 (2) (i) and which must include one rainy season commencing on the 1st of May and ending the 30th of September each year.

13. At the request of the Board the Chief Engineer shall certify when a house built improved or extended under these Regulations is available for occupation and the applicant shall thereupon be required to take possession thereof.

14. An advance to purchase land will not normally be granted unless the applicant satisfies the Board that he is in a position, with or without the help of a further advance to commence building operations within twelve months of the date of the advance and gives an undertaking to the Board that he will do so.

15. No application for an advance to purchase a parcel of land will be considered by the Board unless the applicant produces a written agreement for sale from the vendor guaranteeing transfer of a clear title immediately upon completion of the purchase.

16. Before granting an advance to purchase a parcel of land the Board must be satisfied as to :—

(i) the size, situation, healthiness and general suitability of the site for residential purposes ; and

(ii) the value of the land as assessed by the Chief Federal Land Officer ; and

(iii) the adequacy of title to the land which the vendor is able to transfer to the applicant upon completion of the purchase.

17. No application for an advance to purchase a house will be considered by the Board unless the applicant produces a written agreement for sale from the vendor guaranteeing vacant possession of the house to the applicant immediately upon completion of the purchase.

18. Before granting an advance to purchase a house the Board must be satisfied as to :—

(i) the size, situation, healthiness and general suitability of the site of the house for residential purposes ; and

(ii) the value and state of repair of the house as ascertained by the Chief Engineer ; and

(iii) the ability of the applicant to prove that on purchase he would obtain a clear title either to the freehold of the land on which the house is situated or to a lease for a period not less than the period of repayment of the advance.

19. An officer who has received an advance from the Board to build, improve, extend or purchase a house under these Regulations shall be required to maintain the house in a proper state of repair during the period of the repayment of the advance. In order to ensure the due observance of this requirement such a house shall be subject to periodical inspections by the Chief Engineer during the said period. The Board may, in its discretion, direct that any necessary repairs shall be carried out at the expense of the said officer.

20. (1) A house built, improved, extended or purchased under these Regulations shall be insured by the officer who has received the advance with an approved Insurance Company against damage by fire or tornado for its full established value or actual cost throughout the period of repayment of the advance. The insurance policy shall be drawn in favour of the Chairman of the Board and shall be deposited with the Secretary together with all subsequent renewal receipts on the policy.

(2) The cost of the premiums in respect of the insurance policy may, if the Board so approve, be deducted from the salary of the officer who has received the advance.

(3) A list of Insurance Companies approved by the Board shall be maintained by the Secretary.



## Sub-letting.

21. An officer who has received an advance to build, improve, extend or purchase a house under these Regulations shall not sub-let the house or any part thereof during the period of repayment of the advance except with the prior permission of the Board. Such permission will only be given in exceptional circumstances.

## Structural alterations.

22. No structural alteration to any house built, improved, extended or purchased under these Regulations shall be undertaken during the period of repayment of the advance except with the prior permission of the Board.

## Security of advances.

23. (1) An officer who has received an advance to purchase land or the reversionary interest therein or to build, improve, extend or purchase a house under these Regulations shall mortgage his interest in the land and/or buildings thereon as a first mortgage to the Government of the Federation until the advance is fully repaid.

(2) Such an officer shall deposit the title deeds to the land and/or buildings with the Secretary pending the completion, at the officer's expense, of the mortgage deed.

## Deduction from pension or gratuity.

24. (1) A pensionable officer shall be required by the Board to agree to deduction being made from any pension or gratuity which may be granted to him on retirement if he retires before completing the repayment of any advance made to him or from any gratuities which may be granted to his legal representatives in the event of his death whilst in the service of the Federal or any Regional Government.

(2) An officer who contributes to a provident fund shall be required by the Board to provide, as security for an advance to him any sum outstanding to his credit in such provident fund.

## Rate of interest on advances.

25. All advances made under these Regulations shall bear interest at the rate of 3 per centum per annum.

## Repayment of advances.

26. Advances shall be repayable as follows:—

(i) advances, to build, improve or extend a house—within a period not exceeding twenty years, the first instalment being paid in the month following the month of the issue of the completion certificate in accordance with Regulation 12 (2);

(ii) advances to purchase land or the reversionary interest therein—

(a) where building operations are commenced within twelve months of the receipt of the advance and a further advance is granted for the purpose of building, the advances shall be consolidated at the date of the issue of the completion certificate in accordance with Regulation 12 (2) and shall be repayable thereafter as though they were an advance to build a house;

(b) in any other case, the advance shall be repayable within a period not exceeding five years, the first instalment being paid in the month following the month of the payment of the advance;

(iii) advances to purchase a house—within a period not exceeding twenty years, the first instalment being paid in the month following the month of payment of the advance.

27. (1) The repayment of an advance together with payment of interest thereon shall be effected by consecutive equated monthly instalments, the amount of each such monthly instalment being stated in an agreement to be made between the Chairman and the borrower.

(2) With the consent of the parties to such agreement, the amount of the monthly instalment may be increased so as to effect a speedier repayment than that originally agreed upon, provided always that the method of repayment shall be by consecutive equated monthly instalments.

(3) Repayment of the advance in whole or in part together with the payment of interest may likewise be made by the payment of a lump sum, provided that the lump sum is not less than the aggregate of six monthly instalments and provided that, if repayment is not made in full, the amount of the monthly instalment of repayment of the balance shall be recomputed.

28. In the event of an officer dying, being dismissed or leaving the service of the Federal or any Regional Government before the repayment of an advance granted to him is completed, the Board may consider the advisability of accepting an arrangement whereby the payment of instalments by the officer or by his family may continue until the repayment of the advance is completed.

## Stamp Duties and registration fees.

29. Stamp Duties and Registration fees shall be payable by the borrower upon all documents relating to the advance.
