**APPOINTMENTS OF QUEEN'S COUNSEL IN THE FEDERATION OF NIGERIA**

His Excellency the Governor-General wishes to make known, particularly among Members of the Bar, the procedure he will follow in receiving, considering and submitting for consideration of Her Majesty's Pleasure applications for appointment to be of Her Majesty's Counsel.

2. The status and responsibilities of Queen's Counsel in the Federation of Nigeria are the same as those of Queen's Counsel in the United Kingdom and the honour will be granted sparingly, regard being had to, amongst other things, the number of barristers practising in the Federation and the number who already hold the rank of Queen's Counsel. The following conditions must be satisfied in every case :—

(a) The applicant must be a practising barrister of at least ten year's standing ;

(b) he must be of irreproachable conduct and professional eminence ; and

(c) the application must receive the firm recommendation of both the Chief Justice of the Federation and of the Governor-General before it can be submitted to Her Majesty.

Under the Queen's Counsel Ordinance, 1958, no legal practitioner who has the rank of Queen's Counsel in Nigeria shall perform any of the functions which, in England, are performed by a solicitor and are not performed by a barrister. For the time being, a legal practitioner who has the rank of Queen's Counsel shall not be precluded from continuing or engaging in partnership with another legal practitioner who performs the functions of a solicitor.

3. Should a member of the Bar wish to be considered for the honour of appointment as Queen's Counsel, bearing in mind that recommendations for such an honour will be made on the principles set out in paragraph 2 above and that the honour will be sparingly granted, he should address his application to the Secretary to the Governor-General. Any application should state the names of two or three Judges before whom the applicant has frequently practised so that they may be consulted as to the applicant's claims for consideration. The Governor-General will then consult with the Chief Justice of the Federation and through him with the Chief Justices of the High Courts and, if the applicant practises mainly in a Region, with the Governor of that Region, before tendering through the Secretary of State for the Colonies his recommendations to Her Majesty.

## Government Notice No. 765

## REFUND OF IMPORT DUTY ON GAS AND DIESEL OIL USED FOR INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES

When Legal Notice No. 38 of 1959 was published in the *Supplement to the Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette Extraordinary* No. 79 of 1959, it was stated that the Federal Government would be prepared to make *ex gratia* refunds to major industrial consumers in Federal Territory of the difference between the new rate of import duty on gas and diesel oil suitable for use in internal combustion engines (11d per gallon) and that in operation prior to the 31st January, 1959 (2d per gallon).

2. To qualify for such *ex gratia* refunds consumers must show that they use a minimum of 1,000 gallons per month of gas or diesel oil in *static* internal combustion engines or other apparatus for an industrial purpose and that they take deliveries in bulk.

*Ex gratia* refunds will not be made on fuel used in road, rail or sea transport vehicles and applicants must be able to satisfy the Federal Government that separate storage and issuing facilities are maintained for their industrial plant.

4. Applications for refunds should be made to the Permanent Secretary, the Federal Ministry of Commerce and Industry, and should include details of the plant in which the oil is used and describe the steps the applicant proposes to take to prevent the use of oil for purposes other than for which refunds of import duty are sought.

5. Any contravention of the conditions under which *ex gratia* refunds are authorised will naturally result in the withdrawal of any such concession.
