It is notified for general information that an agreement was signed on the 28th of February, 1959, between Her Majesty's Government and the Government of the United Arab Republic concerning financial and commercial relations and British property in Egypt.

2. The Agreement terminates all restrictive measures against British nationals under Proclamation No. 5 of November 1959, and also covers the following categories of British Property in Egypt.

(a) SEQUESTERED PROPERTY—British Property affected by the Sequestration measures taken by the Government of the United Arab Republic between 30th, October 1956 and the date of the signature of the present Agreement.

(b) EGYPTIANISED PROPERTY—British Property sold by the Egyptian Authorities under Proclamation No. 5 of November 1956

SEQUESTERED PROPERTY

The Agreement provides for desquestration and obliges the United Arab Republic to administer and protect sequestered property until its return to the owners, provided they apply within one year.

Owners of Sequestered property can, on application, obtain the return of their property from the Sequestrator-General of British Property. Copies of the special application form required may be obtained from the British Property Section of the Foreign office at 7 Carlton Garden, London S.W. 1. The application form when completed should be accompanied by particulars of identity and a statement of the assets being claimed.

Owners of Sequestered property do not necessarily have to go back to Egypt to deal with their property but may appoint agents. Where agents are appointed, however, the application to the Sequestrator-General should include an authority appointing the agent. The British Property Section of the Foreign office will be willing to offer advice, if required, on the appointment of agents.

After restoration, any owner who feels that his property has suffered injury or damage as a result of the sequestration may submit claims for compensation to the Foreign Compensation Commission referred to below.

EGYPTIANISED PROPERTY

This property will not be returned but owners will be entitled to claim compensation from the lump sum paid under the Agreement to Her Majesty's Government. The distribution of the lump sum will be entrusted by Her Majesty's Government to the Foreign Compensation Commission.
