Commencement : 7th May, 1959

Notes.—(1) Registration of importers and distributors already made will remain in force.

(2) Forms mentioned in this notice may be printed privately provided they conform in all respects (including colour) with the approved forms, specimens of which may be seen at any Custom House.

PART A

REGISTRATION OF IMPORTERS AND DISTRIBUTORS OF MOTOR SPIRIT

The prescribed authority is the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise (Government Notice No. 318 of 1952 refers. With effect from 1st April, 1959 the Comptroller has been redesignated Chairman).

2. In accordance with section 3 of the Ordinance every importer and distributor of motor spirit must be registered. Applications for registration should be addressed to the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise, Mosaic House, Lagos. The certificates of registration which will be issued free of charge, will remain in force until cancelled and will not require annual renewal.

3. Government Notice No. 401 of 1952 is hereby cancelled: The last returns to be submitted under sections 7 and 9 of the said Notice will be for the quarter ending 31st March, 1959.

PART B

RETURNS OF DISTRIBUTION OF DUTIABLE MOTOR SPIRIT AND DIESEL OIL

The prescribed authority is the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise (Legal Notice 122 of 1959 refers)

2. In order to perform the duties imposed on him by subsection (1) of section 156 of the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954 to 1959, the authority must

(a) ascertain the total quantities of dutiable motor spirit and diesel oil delivered to retail selling points within each Region and

(b) ensure that all dutiable motor spirit and diesel oil withdrawn from Bond is ultimately included in the deliveries under (a) above.

3. To obtain the aforementioned particulars the authority in accordance with Regulation (3) hereby gives notice that registered importers and registered distributors will be required to furnish the following information, where applicable:

(a) a list of the premises other than retail selling points used for the storage of motor spirit and/or diesel oil;

(b) The quantity of duty-paid motor spirit and diesel oil withdrawn from Bond;

(c) the quantity of opening and closing stock of duty-paid storage depots;

(d) the quantity of duty-paid motor spirit and diesel oil delivered according to region from storage depots to

(i) retail selling points

(ii) to consumers and

(iii) appropriations to own use;

(e) the quantity of dutiable motor spirit and diesel oil transferred to other storage depots;

(f) the quantity of dutiable motor spirit and diesel oil received from other storage depots;

(g) the quantity of dutiable motor spirit and diesel oil gained or lost in transit, filling or decanting.

4. The above information must be rendered quarterly, in duplicate, on forms of return supplied by the authority, free of charge. Separate returns must be rendered in respect of motor spirit and diesel oil and for each storage depot. The returns must reach the authority not later than thirty days after the close of the quarter to which they relate, except that the first return for diesel oil will become due not later than thirty days after the date of this notice.

5. Returns in respect of retail selling points will not be required.

6. The first returns for motor spirit and premises will be required for the quarter commencing 1st April, 1959 and for diesel oil for the quarter commencing 1st January, 1959.

7. Should any further information be required, importers and distributors are requested to write to the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise, Mosaic House, Lagos.
