## SECTION 1.—GENERAL

03101. *Interpretation.*

(a) The term "married woman" includes a woman separated from her husband, but does not include a widow nor a woman divorced from her husband.

(b) The term "Women Government servants" includes established, unestablished and daily paid staff. It also includes women appointed on monthly terms.

03102. Application of General Orders to women: Notwithstanding that throughout General Orders the term "officer", "employee", and "Government servant" are referred to in the masculine gender, the provisions thereof apply equally to women Government servants except that :—

(a) provisions about the wives of Government servants do not apply to the husbands of women Government servants; and

(b) the child of a woman Government servant shall be deemed NOT to be entirely dependent on her (see General Order 01002) unless the father of the child is dead or the woman Government servant is divorced from the father and has been awarded legal custody of the child.

## SECTION 2.—EMPLOYMENT OF MARRIED WOMEN

03201. Indigenous women who are married under the Marriage Ordinance or under customary law or under Mohammedan Law may be admitted to the permanent establishment of those grades of the Federal Public Service for which they are qualified, on equal terms with men and single women. The provision in the last sentence of General Order 02109 is hereby revoked.

03202. Indigenous women Government servants who marry while in the Public Service should immediately notify their Heads of Departments of their marriage (whether the marriage is under Marriage Ordinance, under customary law or under Mohammedan Law). Indigenous women Government servants will not be required to resign or retire on marriage but they may exercise their existing right to retire on or after marriage and to be granted a marriage gratuity where applicable.

## SECTION 3.—RULES RELATING TO MATERNITY

03301. *Application.*—This Section shall apply to any pregnant woman Government servant who remains in employment up to a date six weeks before confinement.

03302. A woman Government servant who becomes pregnant shall proceed on leave six weeks before her confinement. A medical certificate showing the prospective date of confinement should be presented not less than three months before the expected date of confinement. No woman Government servant will be permitted to resume duty during the six weeks following her confinement. That part of the total period of absence (which will thus be of three months duration provided that the medical officer correctly estimates the date of confinement) until the officer's accrued vacation leave has been absorbed will be on full pay. Thereafter the balance will be on half-pay and will be counted against the officer's sick leave entitlement for that year. These arrangements will apply to all married women regardless of the date of appointment.

03303. Any disciplinary proceedings against a woman Government servant which might otherwise have been taken during the period of her maternity leave shall be postponed until her maternity leave has expired.

03304. A married woman Government servant on the established staff shall not be called upon to retire or resign by reason of her pregnancy alone, but any woman Government servant, married or unmarried, who undertakes a course of training of not more than six months duration may be called upon to enter into an agreement to refund the whole or part of the cost of the course in the event of her course being interrupted on grounds of pregnancy.

03305. An unmarried woman Government servant may be required to resign her appointment if she becomes pregnant.

03306. Consequent upon General Order 03305 any woman Government servant who becomes pregnant may be required to produce evidence of her marriage (under the Marriage Ordinance, under Mohammedan Law or under customary law) to her Head of Department.

## PART A

## LICENSING OF IMPORTERS OF DUTIABLE TOBACCO

The prescribed authority is the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise (Government Notice No. 399 of 1952 refers; with effect from 1st April, 1959, the Comptroller has been redesignated Chairman).

2. In accordance with section 3 of the Ordinance no person shall import into Nigeria any dutiable tobacco unless he is the holder of a tobacco importer's licence, a specimen of which forms Appendix I to this Notice. Licences will be issued by the Chairman, Board of Customs and Excise, Lagos, to whom all applications should be addressed.

3. Licences expire on the 31st day of December next following the day of issue. They are not transferable and will be issued without the payment of any fee.

The returns from licensed importers must reach the authority not later than thirty days, and the returns from licensed manufacturers must be rendered not later than sixty days after the close of the quarter to which they relate.

4. The first returns will be required for the quarter commencing 1st April, 1959.
