## NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

## INWARD REPORTS

Commencement : 1st April, 1959

Notes.—(i) Forms mentioned in this Notice may be printed privately provided they conform in all respects with approved forms, specimen of which may be seen at any Custom House.

(ii) The attention of all concerned is invited to the Importation and Exportation by Sea Regulations, 1959 (Legal Notice No. 73 of 1959), the Importation and Exportation by Land and Inland Water Regulations, 1959 (Legal Notice No. 75 of 1959) and the Importation and Exportation by Air Regulations, 1959 (Legal Notice No. 71 of 1959).

By virtue of the powers vested in it by sections 12, 14 and 24 of the Customs and Excise Management Ordinance, No. 55 of 1958, the Board of Customs and Excise direct that report shall be made of every ship and aircraft and of all goods carried therein, of every vehicle entering Nigeria by land, and of all goods carried therein, and of all goods otherwise brought into Nigeria by land, in the manner set forth in this notice.

## PART I.—SHIPS (ENTERING NIGERIA BY SEA)

1. *Ships to proceed to a Customs Port.*—Except as permitted in writing by the Board of Customs and Excise, the master of a ship entering Nigeria by sea from any place outside Nigeria shall not cause or permit the ship to call at any place therein other than a Customs port, and any person importing or concerned in importing any goods by sea shall not bring the goods into Nigeria at any place other than a Customs port.

If a ship is compelled by accident, stress of weather or other unavoidable cause to call at a place other than a customs port the master of such ship—

(a) shall immediately report the circumstances which caused the ship to call at such a place to an officer or police officer and on demand produce to him the documents relating to the ship, its cargo and passengers;

(b) shall not without the consent of an officer or police officer permit any goods to be unloaded, or any of the crew or passengers to land, from the ship, unless such unloading of cargo or landing of passengers is necessary to avoid loss of life or loss of ship or cargo;

(c) shall comply with any directions given by an officer or police officer in respect of the ship or cargo.

2. *Approved Customs Ports.*—For a list of approved Customs ports see Legal Notice No. 82 of 1959.

3. *Breaking Bulk.*—When a ship enters Nigeria and prior to making report (see paragraph 6), except with prior permission of the proper officer granted in the form Bk C19, bulk may not be broken nor alteration made in the stowage of goods carried so as to facilitate the unloading of any part thereof; nor any part of the goods staved, destroyed or thrown overboard or any container opened.

4. *Time and Place of Report.*—The master or responsible person authorised by the owner of the ship shall make report within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the ship to the Collector or other proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Custom House at the port of arrival.

Where a ship has been permitted by the Board to call on arrival by sea in Nigeria at a place other than a customs port (see paragraph 1), report of such ship shall be made by the master or authorised person within twenty-four hours after arrival of the ship at that place to the proper officer at that place.

5. *Ships required to report.*—All ships arriving from foreign parts whether in ballast or not, other than those listed below are required to report—

(a) warships of any nationality;

(b) ships owned by or in the service of one of the Governments of the Federation of Nigeria;

(c) fishing vessels granted a special transire by the Board;

(d) yachts;

(e) tugs (unless towing barges or disabled vessels, and tugs from foreign).

6. *Form of Report.*—Report of a ship must be made in the form C5. The following goods must be listed separately on the report:

(a) goods to be cleared locally;

(b) goods for other Nigerian ports listed according to port;

(c) goods for transshipment grouped according to ports of destination;

(d) goods in transit;

(e) goods remaining on board for exportation (which need not be itemised);

(f) over carried cargo.

With regard to (b) above attention is drawn to the Customs Notice No. 8, "The Carriage of Goods from one Port or Place in Nigeria to Another" (Government Notice No. 697 of 1959, previously numbered 677 of 1959).

All reports must be in the English language, legible, and either typewritten or written in ink. Should the report consist of several pages the master or his authorised agent must initial each page below the last item, endorse on page one the total number of pages and number each page as a fraction of the total, e.g., page one of a five page report would be endorsed "Five pages" and each page numbered 1/5, 2/5, 3/5, 4/5 and 5/5.

In lieu of listing numerous items on the form C5, manifests, provided they are of stout paper and contain all the particulars required by form C5, may be accepted as part of a report. In such cases the number of pages of the manifest must be endorsed on the covering form C5, e.g., "as per five pages of manifest", and each page numbered as above.

An authorised agent must sign for and on behalf of his firm.

7. *Sealing.*—The pages of the report must be sealed with a seal capable of positive identification as the master's or agent's seal and be so affixed that pages cannot be withdrawn or added.

8. *Description of Goods.*—The report is to be made out according to the particulars given on the bills of lading, the names and addresses of consignees as well as the quantities and descriptions of the goods being specified on the report.

9. *Goods to be particularly reported.*—The precise descriptions and quantities of the following goods must be specifically reported unless remaining on board for exportation:

Animals  
Cigarettes  
Cigars  
Explosives (including gun powder)  
Firearms and Ammunition  
Fireworks  
Inflammable goods  
Petroleum product in bulk  
Plants (including seeds)  
Spirits  
Tobacco  
Wine.

10. *Goods which need not be reported.*—The following goods need not be reported:—

Crew's effects  
Items listed on the Parcels List  
*Bona fide* passengers' accompanied baggage.

11. *Cubic Measurement or Weight.*—The report of every ship must show the weight or cubic measurement of the cargo according to each bill of lading and is to contain a declaration that such weight or measurement is that on which freight has been charged. If no freight has been charged the weight or measurement normally chargeable for that amount and quantity of goods is to be stated.

12. *Ships in Ballast.*—Reports for ships arriving without cargo other than stores or passengers' accompanied baggage and crew's effects are to be endorsed "In Ballast" or "Nil" in the space used for reporting cargo.

13. *Alteration to Reports.*—At the time of making report the master or his authorised agent must initial and date any alterations.

14. *Amendment to Reports.*—After a report has been accepted by the proper officer applications to amend a report must be submitted in the form C8, the reasons for the required amendment being stated in full.

15. *Advance Striking.*—To facilitate speedy release of goods at certain prescribed ports advance manifests may be submitted prior to report of the ship. Full details of the scheme and the conditions attached thereto may be obtained on application to the officer in charge of the port.

16. *Additional Information.*—The person making report shall at the time of making it answer all such questions and produce all such documents in his possession or control relating to the ship, the goods carried therein, the crew and passengers and voyage as may be put to him or required by the proper officer.

17. *Additional Documents.*—The following documents must also be submitted at the time of making report:—

- (i) A declaration of the number of mail bags carried;
- (ii) If required, clearance from the last port of call;
- (iii) If from foreign via another Nigerian port, transire in the form C43 for any goods loaded at that port.

18. *Documents to be produced at the time of boarding:—*

- (i) Passenger List;
- (ii) Crew (articled and otherwise) Declaration;
- (iii) Stores List;
- (iv) Parcels List (i.e., goods carried for which a Bill of Lading is not issued);
- (v) A list in duplicate of all firearms, ammunition and explosives for discharge at that port.

19. *Wreck.*—Any person concerned with, or having knowledge of goods brought or coming into Nigeria by sea, not being carried in a ship as cargo, stores or baggage, shall report such goods to the nearest officer or police officer.

## PART II.—SHIPS (ENTERING NIGERIA BY INLAND WATERWAYS)

20. *Approved Routes*.—Ships entering Nigeria by inland waterways must use an approved route and forthwith bring the ship from the frontier to the Customs station. The routes approved and customs stations are:—

21. *Form of Report*.—At the customs station the master or owner of the ship must report his cargo, orally in the case of canoes engaged in customary local trade, and other ships in the following manner:—

- (a) Western Frontier—In the form C.43 in duplicate;
- (b) Northern Frontier—In the form C.45 in duplicate;
- (c) Eastern Frontier—Orally.

The forms if any should show separately:—

- (i) goods for immediate clearance;
- (ii) goods for clearance at the Nigerian port of destination;
- (iii) goods for transhipment or in transit;
- (iv) goods loaded in Nigeria.

Objection would not be taken to the use of manifests to support forms C.43 and C.45. The master or owner of the ship must produce any documents, invoices, etc., in his possession relating to the cargo carried.

22. *Ships in Transit*.—Ships arriving direct from foreign and proceeding to French Territory via the Western or Northern boundary must report in accordance with Part I of this notice at:

## PART III.—AIRCRAFT

23. *Aircraft to land at Customs Airport*.—Except as permitted in writing by the Board, the commander of an aircraft entering Nigeria from a place outside Nigeria shall not cause or permit it to land for the first time after its arrival therein at any other place than a Customs airport, and any person importing goods in any aircraft shall not bring the goods into Nigeria at any place other than a Customs airport.

Should an aircraft flying to Nigeria be required under or by virtue of any enactment relating to air navigation, or be compelled by accident, stress of weather or other unavoidable cause, to land at a place in Nigeria other than a customs airport the commander of any such aircraft,

(a) shall immediately report the landing to an officer or police officer, and on demand produce to him the journey log book or document in lieu thereof belonging to the aircraft;

(b) shall not, without the consent of an officer or police officer, permit any good to be unloaded from or any of the crew or passengers to depart from the vicinity of the aircraft unless unloading or departure is necessary to avoid loss of life, aircraft or cargo;

(c) shall comply with any directions given by an officer or police officer in respect of the aircraft or cargo.

24. *Approved Customs Airport*.—For a list of approved customs airports see Order No. 7 of 1953 and Legal Notice No. 157 of 1956.

25. *Examination Station*.—The commander of the aircraft shall immediately take the aircraft or cause it to be taken to the examination station at the customs airport at which the aircraft has arrived.

26. *Time and place of report*.—The commander or responsible person authorised by the owner of the aircraft shall forthwith make report after the arrival of the aircraft to the Collector or other proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Custom House at the airport of arrival.

Where an aircraft has been permitted by the Board to call on arrival by air in Nigeria at a place other than a Customs airport (see paragraph 23) report of such aircraft shall be made by the commander or authorised person forthwith after arrival of the aircraft at that airport to the proper officer at that airport.

27. *Aircraft required to report*.—All aircraft arriving from foreign parts whether carrying goods or not other than military aircraft as defined by Article 77 (1) of the Colonial Air Navigation Order, 1955, are required to report to the proper officer.



28. *Form of Report.*—Report of an aircraft must be made by the commander or authorised agent in duplicate in the form C6 General Declaration, and be supported, where appropriate by:

- (a) Passenger's manifest in the form C6A in duplicate;
- (b) Cargo Manifest in the form C6B in duplicate;
- (c) Air Crew Declaration in the form C66;
- (d) Stores List in duplicate.

29. Paragraphs 7 to 18 apply equally to aircraft reports.

#### PART IV.—VEHICLES

30. *Procedure on entering Nigeria by Land.*—Except as is otherwise provided, no person shall import goods into Nigeria by land by a route other than an approved route or between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The person in charge of every vehicle entering Nigeria by land shall forthwith bring the vehicle from the frontier to the proper Customs station (see below) and there make verbal report of the vehicle to the proper officer. The person in charge of the vehicle shall not remove or permit the removal of goods from the vehicle and shall not permit the vehicle to leave the customs station without the authority of the proper officer.
