AMENDMENT TO GENERAL ORDERS

It is hereby notified for general information that Federal General Order 22118 has been revised with effect from the 1st of March, 1959 as shown below:—

Establishment Division,
Office of the Prime Minister of the Federation,
Lagos
27th October, 1959.

22118. *Date of cessation.*—Basic allowance will cease:—

(a) On the fifth anniversary of the date the vehicle (whether new or second-hand) was first registered with a motor licensing authority, whether in the United Kingdom, Nigeria or elsewhere. (The officer is responsible for producing evidence of the date of first registration to his Head of Department). Provided that if an officer furnishes a monthly honour certificate that his motor car has been kept in a road-worthy condition and has actually been used for the execution of his official duties during the period in respect of which motor car basic allowance is claimed, he may continue to draw the allowance up to a maximum period of 7 years from the date his car was first registered.

(b) On the date the officer ceases to own the vehicle.

(c) On the date the officer draws an advance to purchase another vehicle.

(d) On the date the officer starts drawing motor transport allowance in respect of another vehicle.

(e) On the date the vehicle is damaged to such an extent that it is unlikely again to be road-worthy.

(f) On the date the officer proceeds on leave knowing that he will not be returning to duty in Nigeria.

(g) On the date a contract officer, whose current contract will expire at the end of that leave, proceeds on leave; provided that if the officer is later re-engaged by the Federal Government and resumes duty in Nigeria without a break in service at the expiry of his leave, he may draw the amount of basic allowance which has been withheld from him in respect of such leave.

(h) On the date the officer ceases duty in Nigeria to undertake duties outside Nigeria expected to last at least a year, or to take up a course of instruction or scholarship expected to last at least a year.

(i) Two months after the date on which the officer while on duty outside Nigeria, scholarship or course of instruction, becomes aware that it will last at least a year whichever occurs first.

(j) On the date when an officer on the permanent establishment or on a contract not expiring with leave, gives notice, while on leave, of his intention to resign or retire.

The width of the said strip will be approximately 60 feet throughout except along the bed of the Bonny River where it will be 100 feet.

The route of the centre line is described as follows:—

Starting at a point (marked 'A' on the plan) in the Ogoni Division, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-east of Dere Village

(2) Where it traverses mangrove swamp it will be laid $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep.

(3) Where it runs along the Bonny River the line will rest on the river bed except where it crosses the entrance to the Opobo Channel where it will be buried at least 6 feet below the river bed.

(4) There will be two riser platforms of 24 feet \times 25 feet on the Bonny River which will rise approximately 16' above lowest water level as shown delineated on plan No. 7413.

All bearings and distances are approximate and all bearings refer to True North.

2. A copy of a plan of the pipeline route identifying the land and river affected can be inspected during all normal working hours at the District Offices, Port Harcourt, Bori and Degema; the Federal Ministry of Lagos Affairs, Mines and Power, Lagos; the Commissioner of Lands' Office, Enugu; and the Offices at Owerri, Umuobiakani and Port Harcourt of the aforesaid Company.

3. TOURIST TRAVEL

It is notified for general information that with effect from the 1st November, 1959, Tourist Travel Allowance is available for all countries outside the Scheduled Territories.

2. Persons resident in Nigeria will be permitted £250 per head during any "travel year" for the purpose of travel in any country outside the Scheduled Territories.

3. Applications for exchange facilities in excess of £250 per head in any one "travel year" should be submitted to the Nigerian Exchange Control.

4. The special allotments for cars and motorcycles and the special allotments for persons travelling in charge of parties using collective passports, as well as the special arrangements in respect of travel in Denmark (including the Faroe Islands and Greenland), Norway and Sweden are hereby withdrawn as from 1st November, 1959.

5. Where Authorised Dealers receive applications from residents of the Scheduled Territories other than Nigeria they may issue travel facilities up to an amount of £250.

6. Letters of Credit or Travellers Cheques provided under paragraphs 2, 3 and 5 above may be made available anywhere in the world.

7. Any amount provided under paragraphs 2, 3 and 5 must continue to be recorded on page 31 of the traveller's passport.

8. The use of Forms V is discontinued. Travel Agents may provide services outside the Scheduled Territories, e.g., hotel accommodation, meals en route, couriers, etc., against payment in sterling in Nigeria without formality. The cost of such services need no longer be deducted from the amount of exchange authorised for the travel. Passports need not be marked.

9.
