COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM, 1960

Under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan various Governments within the Commonwealth are providing fellowships and scholarships, mainly for postgraduate study, tenable in their countries by men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth. It is expected that when the Plan is in full operation there will be over a thousand such awards, 500 of which will be tenable in the United Kingdom. So that the Plan may be started at the earliest possible date, the United Kingdom offers for immediate competition by Commonwealth students up to 250 scholarships tenable at institutions of higher learning in the United Kingdom from the beginning of the academic year in October 1960. (It is not intended at this stage to invite applications for fellowships and this announcement applies only to scholarships.)

The scholarships aim at providing opportunities for Commonwealth students normally resident in other countries to pursue advanced courses or undertake research in the United Kingdom. They are intended for persons of high intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to life in their own countries on their return from study abroad. They are primarily available for postgraduate study or research at universities and colleges of technology, but in special circumstances may be held for courses of undergraduate study or at other institutions.

Tenure.—A scholarship is tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a university degree or similar qualification. Exceptionally an award may be made for one academic year only and in appropriate circumstances (e.g., a postgraduate scholar whose work for a higher degree is found to require three years) it may be extended for a third year.
