(3) An Overseas Allowance. For instance, in London the overseas allowance for a Scale A officer is £740 per annum if married and £4 0 per annum if single, and in Washington £1.970 per annum if married and £1,340 per annum if single.

(4) Rent Supplement. If an officer is not occupying accommodation owned or leased by Government, he is granted a Rent Supplement to assist him to rent suitable accommodation.
