## COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM, 1960

Under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan various Governments within the Commonwealth are providing fellowships and scholarships, mainly for postgraduate study, tenable in their countries by men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth. It is expected that when the Plan is in full operation there will be over a thousand such awards, 500 of which will be tenable in the United Kingdom. So that the Plan may be started at the earliest possible date, the United Kingdom offers for immediate competition by Commonwealth students up to 250 scholarships tenable at institutions of higher learning in the United Kingdom from the beginning of the academic year in October 1960. (It is not intended at this stage to invite applications for fellowships and this announcement applies only to scholarships.)

The scholarships aim at providing opportunities for Commonwealth students normally resident in other countries to pursue advanced courses or undertake research in the United Kingdom. They are intended for persons of high intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to life in their own countries on their return from study abroad. They are primarily available for postgraduate study or research at universities and colleges of technology, but in special circumstances may be held for courses of undergraduate study or at other institutions.

**Tenure.**—A scholarship is tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a university degree or similar qualification. Exceptionally an award may be made for one academic year only and in appropriate circumstances (e.g., a postgraduate scholar whose work for a higher degree is found to require three years) it may be extended for a third year. Each award will be made on the understanding that it will be continued for the period of the programme of study or research for which it is granted provided that the scholar's progress and conduct are satisfactory.

**Emoluments.**—The emoluments will cover expenses of travel, living and study during tenure of the scholarship as well as an initial clothing grant and a marriage allowance in the case of scholars accompanied by their wives.

**Eligibility.**—Candidates must normally be Commonwealth citizens or British protected persons who are or, by the time of taking up an award in 1960, will be *Graduates of a University or College in their Country or holders of an equivalent qualification*. Applications will also be considered from such persons without a degree or similar qualification who wish to take a first course of study in the United Kingdom, provided they are normally resident in a Country where no University or College offers courses in the subjects of their choice. Thus awards will not be made for courses of study leading to a first degree or its equivalent which are available at the University College, Ibadan and at the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology. The Scholarships are open only to persons who are normally resident in countries of the Commonwealth other than the United Kingdom.

**Age limits.**—Scholarships are open to both men and women who will not have reached their 35th birthday by 1st October, 1960, but preference will be given to candidates who are between 22 and 28 years of age.

**Method of application.**—Applications should, in the first instance, be made by letter,

(a) in the case of persons resident in the Regions, to the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Education in the candidate's Region;

(b) in the case of persons resident in Lagos, to the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Education; and

(c) in the case of persons resident in the Southern Cameroons, to the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Social Services,
