## STATEMENT BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATION

When the Final Report of the Parliamentary Committee on Nigerianisation was published as Sessional Paper No. 6 of 1959, in order that it might be available to the Members of the House of Representatives at their final meeting, it was made clear in a Foreword that the Report had just been received by the Federal Government and that the Government had therefore had no time in which to study it or to formulate views upon the recommendations which the Report contained. It was hoped at that time that the work could be carried through the necessary stages and that decisions could be reached and published during the life of the present Government. This has not proved possible. Consideration of the various questions arising has now reached an advanced stage but the decisions to be taken are important ones and not such as the Government should be asked to make at a time when the House of Representatives has already been dissolved with a view to the impending General Elections.

2. Nevertheless, in view of the wide public interest which the Report has awakened, the Government thinks it proper to issue this brief statement as an acknowledgment of the valuable work done by the Parliamentary Committee and to inform the public about the action which has so far been taken in respect of the Committee's recommendations for improved procedures in the various Divisions and Departments.

3. The Federal Government wishes to express its appreciation of the devoted service which has been given by the Chairman and members of the Parliamentary Committee in their detailed examination of the Public Service and in the compilation of the Report. Although it may not be possible for the Government with its fuller knowledge of the systems—many of them in a transitional stage—on which the Public Service is conducted, and of the purpose underlying these systems, to agree in all respects with the conclusions reached by the Committee, their study of the staff problems now confronting the Government undoubtedly possesses great value. It focuses attention on differences between the Nigerianisation procedures of the different Ministries and Divisions of Ministries, thus opening the way to useful reforms. By bringing some larger questions of principle into the daylight it provides an opportunity to the Government to explain its policy in these matters.

4. Comments have been made by each of the Ministries and extra-ministerial Departments on the sections of the Report which directly concern them. In some cases these comments agree generally with the views of the Parliamentary Committee but in other cases objections are raised either to the facts upon which the Committee relied or to the conclusions drawn from them. All the relevant papers have been passed to the Nigerianisation Officer who is now investigating the actual position and will make specific recommendations in each case to the responsible Ministers and to the Prime Minister.

5. Although for the reasons shown in the first paragraph of this statement the Government feels bound to reserve its views on the several questions of principle raised in Part II of the Report, the implications of one of these questions are such that a reply and an explanation must be made now. The Government cannot agree with the interpretation placed by the Parliamentary Committee on Special List 'B' and upon the intentions of the expatriate officers of the Federal Public Service who have joined that List. Because credence has been given to this interpretation in a local newspaper in contradiction of the statement made by the Prime Minister in a reply to a written question in the House of Representatives at its last meeting, the Government wishes to make it clear beyond doubt that it dissociates itself from the statements made by the Committee that those officers who have joined Special List 'B' have thereby indicated their intention to leave the service of the Federation, or in the unfortunately chosen words of the Report are "passengers".

6. The Government wishes to make it clear that it stands unreservedly by the statement by leaders of the main political parties in 1954 that expatriate officers who wish to continue to serve in Nigeria after independence will be welcome, and will be accorded continued employment in accordance with traditional service principles and fair terms of service. The coming of independence to Nigeria in October 1960, will vest in every entitled overseas officer a continuing right to retire on pension, together with a lump sum by way of compensation for the loss of career. The introduction of a compensation scheme will not confer, and was never intended to confer, upon the Government of the Federation any right to terminate an officer's pensionable career other than for those reasons for which the power has always rested to dispense with an officer's service, i.e., misconduct or inefficiency. It was because the Government of the Federation realised that it might be unable to retain expatriate officers whose services could ill be spared, particularly those officers in the middle range whose financial circumstances and family commitments would be such that they could not afford not to take advantage of lump-sum compensation, that it sought, in co-operation with Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, to make some arrangement whereby officers might obtain, in advance, some of the advantages of lump-sum compensation and yet be attracted to continue to render service to Nigeria. Government is under a debt of gratitude for the generous assistance given by Her Majesty's Government in devising the arrangement, and has welcomed the response to it amongst officers of the Federal Service. Officers who have joined Special List 'B' retain their continuing right to retire, but, in exchange for the advance granted to them of the ultimate compensation they will receive on retirement, undertake to give not less than twelve months' notice to the Federal Government. It is entirely incorrect to interpret joining Special List 'B' as the expression of an officer's intention to retire in twelve months' time, or as soon as compensation is available. The Government agreed to introduce the Special List 'B' scheme with the sole object of retaining in Nigeria some of the officers who would otherwise have been tempted to retire, and the Government is confident that the scheme will have the effect intended.

7. It will be for the new Government which will be formed after the Elections to make its decisions on all matters raised in the Report of the Committee.

(i) Honours degree and post-graduate courses in Botany, Zoology, Agriculture, Forestry, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics and Modern Languages.

(ii) Professional or degree courses in Veterinary Science, Geology, Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering.

(iii) Professional courses in Accountancy, Architecture, Land Surveying, Quantity Surveying, Hydrographic Surveying, Building Surveying Valuation and Estate Management;

(iv) Honours degree courses in Arts and Economics (with Accountancy or Banking, Statistics, Public Finance, Trade and Industry or Sociology as the principal subject);

(v) Courses leading to Honours Degree in Anthropology with specialisation in Ethnography and Archaeology.

3. Awards will also be made for post secondary and post-graduate studies, the successful completion of which will qualify the holders for higher posts not necessarily in the service of Government. Awards in this category will be made for

(i) Teacher Training (including courses for degrees in Arts and Science, and for the Diploma in Education); special awards for training to teach in Technical Institutes and Trade Centres will be made;

(ii) Banking;

(iii) Insurance and Actuarial practice;

(iv) Accountancy, Secretaryship and Librarianship;

(v) Pharmacy, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.

4. Awards will not be made for courses in the Faculty of Law.

5. In the Faculty of Medicine awards will be confined to a limited number of Nigerian medical students who have already completed their pre-registration service for post-graduate specialisation in the following fields of Medicine:—

Anaesthetics,  
Dermatology.



6. Selected candidates will be required to enter into bonds to serve as directed by the Federal Government on the completion of their training.

7. Applications for scholarship awards may be made by candidates of either sex, preference being given to those under 30 years of age. Candidates will be required to possess the minimum educational qualifications required by the Institution at which the course is to be taken. In all cases, awards will be made only if candidates of suitable character and educational attainments are forthcoming.

8. The majority of awards will be for courses now available either wholly or in part at Colleges in West Africa, namely:—

University College, Ibadan, Nigeria.

Nigeria College of Technology, Ibadan, Enugu or Zaria.

The University College of Ghana.

Kumasi College of Technology or the Fourah Bay College, Freetown, Sierra Leone.

Intending candidates should therefore acquaint themselves with the conditions for entry to these Institutions and must themselves apply direct for admission to the Institutions of their choice. Candidates will be required to produce evidence of acceptance but no guarantee of award can be given to every applicant who has been successful in obtaining entry to one of the West African Colleges.

No candidate will be considered for an award unless he holds at least a Grade II School Certificate (Cambridge or West African) with Credits in English Language and four other subjects allied to the proposed course of study.
