3. No right is given to the holder to dispose of any petroleum or petroleum products.

4. The licence does not give the holder any exclusive right over the area of the licence.

Area.—5. The licence may be granted for any area up to 10,000 square miles.

Period.—6. The licence may be granted for periods of up to one year each period ending on the 31st of December, with an option to renew for one further year.

Fee.—7. The fee for each calendar year or part of a calendar year for which the licence is granted is £50-0s-0d.

B. Oil Exploration Licence (Modified)

Rights.—1. This licence gives the holder the right to undertake geological surface reconnaissance over the land areas South of latitude 7° N., and geophysical survey over off-shore areas within three miles of the coastline.

2. No right to the subsequent grant of an Oil Prospecting Licence or Oil Mining Lease is given or implied, but preference may be given to such an application by the holder of an Exploration Licence provided his work has been carried out in a manner satisfactory to the Government.

3. No right is given to the holder to dispose of any petroleum or petroleum products.

4. The licence does not give the holder any exclusive right over the area of the licence.

Area.—5. The licence may be granted for any area up to 10,000 square miles.

Period.—6. The licence may be granted for periods of up to one year, each period ending on the 31st of December with an option to renew for one further year.

Fee.—7. The fee for each calendar year or part of a calendar year for which the licence is granted is £50-0s-0d.

C. Oil Prospecting Licence

Rights.—1. This licence gives the holder the exclusive right:

(i) to explore for oil by geological and geophysical methods, and to drill for oil;

(ii) to carry away and dispose of petroleum and petroleum products;

(iii) to the grant of an Oil Mining Lease over the whole area of the licence if on land situated South of latitude 7° North, and to one-half of the area if on land North of latitude 7° North or on the Continental Shelf of Nigeria.

Obligations.—2. The Licensee shall:

(i) with all reasonable despatch commence and continue to explore the area by geological or geophysical methods;

(ii) within six months of the date of the grant of the licence begin geophysical investigations which shall continue until drilling operations are begun or the licence terminates;

(iii) before the end of the third year have drilled a minimum of 12,000 feet;

(iv) not later than the third year have started a training scheme for the technical training of Nigerian staff.

Area.—3. The maximum area of a licence is 2,000 square miles on land and 1,000 square miles on the Continental Shelf.

Period.—4. The licence may be granted:

(i) on land for a period of three years with the right to renewal for up to two years; provided the obligations of the Licensee have been carried out to the satisfaction of the Government;

(ii) on the Continental Shelf for a period of four years with the right to renewal for up to three years provided the obligations of the Licensee have been carried out to the satisfaction of the Government.

Shape.—5. The shape of the licence must be quadrilateral and bounded by sides either North-South, East-West, Northeast-Southwest or Northwest-Southeast in direction with a width of not less than one mile.

Rental.—6. The rent for the licence will be 2s per square mile per annum.

Premium.—7. The payment of a premium will be necessary before the grant of a licence:

(i) for the Continental Shelf the premium is £500,000 for 1,000 square miles;

(ii) for the land areas the premium will be variable and will be fixed by the Government. A map showing the rates of premium will be available in the Ministry of Lagos Affairs, Mines and Power as from the 15th of March, 1960, and may be consulted by interested Companies.

Royalty.—8. Royalty will be imposed on all crude oil, natural gas and casinghead spirit won, saved or recovered at the following rates:

(i) 4s per ton on all crude oil of a potential production of up to 500,000 tons per annum, thereafter;

(ii) 12½ per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on land areas including the off-shore area within the three mile limit seawards;

(iii) 10 per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on the Continental Shelf between the three mile limit and the 10 fathom depth line;

(iv) 8 per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on the Continental Shelf beyond the 10 fathom depth line;

(v) 10 per cent of the well-head value on all casinghead spirit;

(vi) Twopence per 1,000 cubic feet of natural gas.

D. Oil Mining lease

Rights.—1. This lease gives the holder the exclusive right to win and dispose of oil and other hydrocarbons and may be granted for any area in Nigeria or on the Continental Shelf.

Obligations.—2. The Lessee shall:

(i) search, bore for, win and work all petroleum;

(ii) start a training scheme for the technical training of Nigerian staff;

(iii) conduct all its operations in accordance with good oil field practice.

Area.—3. The area of a mining lease may be of any size approved by the Government.

Period.—4. The lease may be granted:

(i) on land for a period of up to thirty years with the right to renewal for a further thirty years;

(ii) on the Continental Shelf for a period of up to forty years with the right to renewal for a further forty years.

Shape.—5. The shape of the lease must be bounded by sides either North-South, East-West, Northeast-Southwest or Northwest-Southeast in direction with a width of not less than one mile.

Rental.—6. The rent for the lease will be 2s.6d per acre for the first year increasing to 10s per acre in the sixth and subsequent years.

Premium.—7. The payment of a premium will be necessary before the grant of a lease:

(i) for the Continental Shelf the premium is £500,000 for 1,000 square miles;

(ii) for the land areas the premium will be variable and will be fixed by the Government. A map showing the rates of premium will be available in the Ministry of Lagos Affairs, Mines and Power as from the 15th of March, 1960, and may be consulted by interested Companies,

provided that no applicant will be required to pay a premium over any area on which he has previously paid a premium on the grant of an Oil Prospecting Licence.

Royalty.—8. Royalty will be imposed on all crude oil, natural gas and casinghead spirit won, saved or recovered at the following rates:

(i) 12½ per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on land areas including the off-shore area within the three-mile limit seawards;

(ii) 10 per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on the Continental Shelf between the three mile limit and the 10 fathom depth line;

(iii) 8 per cent of the well-head value of all crude oil won on the Continental Shelf beyond the 10 fathom depth line;

(iv) 10 per cent of the well-head value of casinghead spirit;

(v) Twopence per 1,000 cubic feet of natural gas.

PLANS

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS, 1960

In pursuance of its Nigerianisation policy the Federal Government proposes to award, during 1960, a number of scholarships to Nigerians desiring to be trained for administrative, executive or professional posts.

2. The awards will be closely geared to the staffing needs of the Government which are mainly in the fields of Engineering, the Natural Sciences and Accountancy. Priority will therefore be given to applicants who appear most likely to fit in with those needs. Awards will be made for

(i) Honours degree and post-graduate courses in Botany, Zoology, Agriculture, Forestry, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics and Modern Languages.

(ii) Professional or degree courses in Veterinary Science, Geology, Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering.

(iii) Professional courses in Accountancy, Architecture, Land Surveying, Quantity Surveying, Hydrographic Surveying, Building Surveying Valuation and Estate Management;

(iv) Honours degree courses in Arts and Economics (with Accountancy or Banking, Statistics, Public Finance, Trade and Industry or Sociology as the principal subject);

(v) Courses leading to Honours Degree in Anthropology with specialisation in Ethnography and Archaeology.

3. Awards will also be made for post secondary and post-graduate studies, the successful completion of which will qualify the holders for higher posts not necessarily in the service of Government. Awards in this category will be made for

(i) Teacher Training (including courses for degrees in Arts and Science, and for the Diploma in Education); special awards for training to teach in Technical Institutes and Trade Centres will be made;

(ii) Banking;

(iii) Insurance and Actuarial practice;

(iv) Accountancy, Secretaryship and Librarianship;

(v) Pharmacy, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.

4. Awards will not be made for courses in the Faculty of Laws.

5. In the Faculty of Medicine awards will be confined to a limited number of Nigerian medical students who have already completed their pre-registration service for post-graduate specialisation in the following fields of Medicine:—

Malariaology, Radiology,
Medical Statistics,
Public Health,
Pathology,
Psychiatry,
Nutrition,
Anaesthetics,
Dermatology.

6. Selected candidates will be required to enter into bonds to serve as directed by the Federal Government on the completion of their training.

7. Applications for scholarship awards may be made by candidates of either sex, preference being given to those under 30 years of age. Candidates will be required to possess the minimum educational qualifications required by the Institution at which the course is to be taken. In all cases, awards will be made only if candidates of suitable character and educational attainments are forthcoming.

8. The majority of awards will be for courses now available either wholly or in part at Colleges in West Africa, namely:—

University College, Ibadan, Nigeria.

Nigeria College of Technology, Ibadan, Enugu or Zaria.

The University College of Ghana.

Kumasi College of Technology or the Fourah Bay College, Freetown, Sierra Leone.

Intending candidates should therefore acquaint themselves with the conditions for entry to these Institutions and must themselves apply direct for admission to the Institutions of their choice. Candidates will be required to produce evidence of acceptance but no guarantee of award can be given to every applicant who has been successful in obtaining entry to one of the West African Colleges.

9. No candidate will be considered for an award unless he holds at least a Grade II School Certificate (Cambridge or West African) with Credits in English Language and four other subjects allied to the proposed course of study. Equivalent qualifications gained through the General Certificate of Education examinations will be accepted. As a general rule, for direct entry to courses leading to degrees in Arts, Science and Economics, candidate

require passes in at least two subjects at Advanced level or Principal level. The subjects at both Advanced (or Principal) and Ordinary level which will be accepted for entry to particular courses are specified, and candidates should make sure that they hold the necessary qualifications before applying. For direct entry to professional courses in Engineering the usual requirements are passes in Physics, Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics (or Pure and Applied Mathematics) at advanced level and Chemistry at ordinary level. Persons holding inferior qualifications should NOT apply for an award under this notice.

10. Persons holding permanent pensionable posts in the Federal Public Service or equivalent positions in the Statutory Corporations who wish to pursue courses of study related to the work of their departments or corporations should NOT apply for scholarships under this notice, but should apply for training course awards to the Nigerianisation Officer, Old Secretariat, Lagos.

11. Candidates to whom awards are made will be required to pass a medical examination which will include a tuberculin test and X-Ray examination of the chest.
