In the event of the death of the wife of an officer in receipt of a married rate of overseas allowance in the course of his service overseas the Prime Minister may, if it appears that hardship will ensue if the officer reverts immediately to a single rate of allowance, authorise the officer to continue to receive such proportion of the married rate of allowance as appears justified by the particular circumstances of the case and either for the remainder of his service at the post or such shorter period as appears appropriate.
