#### WESTERN REGION MARKETING BOARD

### 1960 TECHNICAL PALM OIL MARKETING SCHEME-MINIMUM PRODUCER PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Western Region Marketing Board Law (No. 10 of 1954), has fixed the prices set out in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for technical palm oil during 1960 at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in column 1.

2. The minimum prices are based as in previous years on the naked ex-scale Bulk Oil Plant prices less the appropriate cost of transport by the approved normal evacuation routes.

3. Produce Sales Tax.—Under the provisions of the Produce Sales Tax Law 1957 (No. 14 of 1957), all sales of technical palm oil made in the Western Region to the licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to produce sales tax at the rate of £1 per ton.

4. For purposes of collection of this tax for which the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of technical palm oil made to it or its licensed buying agents in the Region, the arrangements set out in paragraph 5, are prescribed.

5. The prices payable by licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for technical palm oil in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns 5, 6 and 7 of the Schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of the produce sales tax).

#### COMMON ENTRANCE EXAMINATION FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1961

The date of the next examination will be Saturday, 2nd July, 1960 for entry in January 1961.

2. It is hoped there will be vacancies for about sixty boys at Umuahia and Afikpo and for thirty at Owerri.

3. The examination papers will contain questions in English, Arithmetic, Geography, History and Rural Science based on the approved syllabus for Primary Schools.

4. The examination is open to *bona fide* pupils in Standard V and VI in Government and Voluntary Agency Schools approved for First School Leaving Certificate and it is not restricted to boys from the Eastern Region.

5. Application Forms may be obtained only from Provincial Education Officers. These must be completed in respect of each candidate and must reach the Provincial Education Officer not later than 7th May, 1960. The Provincial Education Officer will complete the space at the foot of the back of the form and return this section to the candidates who must produce it at the examination. If the form is incompletely or inaccurately filled in, the application is liable to be rejected. The candidate may be expelled if a false statement in his application form is discovered after he has been admitted to the School.

6. Each candidate must pay 5s to the Treasury. (No other method of payment will be accepted). The application Form and Treasury Receipt for the 5s of each candidate must be submitted through the candidate's Headmaster to the Provincial Education Officer. Applications made or forms submitted direct to the Principal will not be entertained.

7. Candidates must be of such an age on the 1st January, 1961 that they will be likely to benefit by secondary education. Normally this age does not exceed thirteen and in no case should it exceed fifteen years. Where no satisfactory evidence of age can be produced the candidate will be judged on his general physical development. No boy will be disqualified from sitting for the examination on the grounds of height alone.

8. There will be centres for the examination at Aba, Afikpo, Awka, Bamenda, Benin, Bida, Calabar, Enugu, Ibadan, Jos, Kaduna, Kumba, Lagos, Makurdi, Ogoja, Okigwi, Onitsha, Owerri, Port-Harcourt, Umuahia, Uyo, Warri, Zaria and at other places at the discretion of the Provincial Education Officer to whom application to sit is made.

9. The School fees which are payable termly in advance are as follows :

At Afikpo and Owerri there is a laundry fee of  $\pounds 1$ per annum. On arrival at the College each boy must deposit the sum of  $\pounds 3$  with the Principal. This sum will be used to cover breakages and the loss of, or damage to school property. A separate account will be kept for each boy and any credit balance will be refunded to him at the end of his school career.

10. Eleven open scholarships will be awarded at both Umuahia and Afikpo and eight at Owerri. They will be awarded on progress during the first year, including performance in the first annual examination, having regard to scholarship awards already held. The scholarships, which cover Board and Tuition Fees only, will normally be tenable for the duration of the school career. They will, however, be subject to periodical review and, provided due warning has been given, may be withdrawn at any time on the grounds of bad conduct or bad work.

11. Admission will be to Class I only. Candidates who pass the written examination will be called, in order of merit, for an interview with the Principal who reserves the right to reject any candidate on the grounds of age or for any other reason. Candidates called for interview must bring with them two recent full face head and shoulders photographs of passport size  $(3'' \times 2'')$ . Unsuccessful candidates will not be informed of the result of the examination and any body who has not been called for interview by 1st October, 1960, can safely assume that he has failed the examination.
