#### B.—EXTERNAL CANDIDATES

#### Conditions of Entry for an External Candidate.

An external candidate is not eligible for the award of the Teachers' Higher Elementary (Grade II) Certificate until he has completed, as a scholar or teacher, a qualifying period of years which shall exceed by one year the minimum aggregate of years spent in schooling and training and teaching by a candidate who passes the internal examination, by the slowest normal route.

#### 2. Conditions of Award

Stage I .- The candidate shall first attempt the papers in English Language and Arithmetic as set by West African Examinations Council and may not proceed to attempt the remaining subjects of the examination until successful in these two papers.
