Notice is hereby given by the Lagos Executive Development Board in accordance with section 24A of the Lagos Town Planning Ordinance as amended by the Lagos Town Planning (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955 and the Lagos Town Planning (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, that the Board intends to apply to the Governor-General in Council for approval of the Order of the Board set forth in the Schedule hereto amending the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 as amended by the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (Amendment) Order, 1958.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to solve problems arising in the course of allocation of plots within the scheme area to original land owners. Express covenants in present conveyances of allocated plots make execution of such conveyances by purchasers necessary in order that they might be legally bound by the covenants and experience has shown that in case of multiple ownerships execution of such conveyances takes upwards of nine months. It has also been discovered that where a deposit has been paid by an intending purchaser, he sometimes fails to complete the sale.

The Order, if approved, will facilitate sale and conveyancing of allocated plots within the Scheme Area, make conditions of such sale binding by operation of law, and also provide stipulation as to time within which to commence and complete buildings on allocated plots.

## SCHEDULE

## LAGOS TOWN PLANNING ORDINANCE (CHAPTER 103)

## LAGOS CENTRAL PLANNING SCHEME, 1951 (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1960

1. This Order may be cited as the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (Amendment) Order, 1960.

2. Clause 4 of the Lagos Central Planning Scheme, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as the Scheme) set out in the schedule to the Lagos Central Planning Scheme (Approval) Order, 1952 is amended by the deletion of paragraph (f) and the following substituted therefor—

“(f) The offer of land within the replanned area to the original owners thereof, as far as it is possible to do so, at the gross cost of acquisition plus a surcharge of 20 per cent in accordance with section 56 (4) of the Ordinance and subject to the conditions, terms and requirements set out in the Fourth Schedule to the Scheme.”

3. The Scheme is amended by the insertion immediately after the Third Schedule of the following new Schedule—

“FOURTH SCHEDULE (Clause 4 (f)) CONDITIONS OF SALE, CONVEYANCING  
ARRANGEMENTS AND BUILDING COVENANTS

1. When upon the acceptance of an offer of allocation of plot part of the purchase price is paid by way of deposit and nothing further is done thereafter within a period of twelve months by the intending purchaser towards the completion of the sale, such deposit shall be refunded to the depositor whereupon the contract of sale shall determine provided a notice has been served on the depositor requesting him to complete the contract within thirty days from the date of such notice and the contract has not been so completed.

2. (i) In all cases of multiple ownerships where compensation is paid by the Board to any person acting under a Power of Attorney from those owners, the Board shall have the right to deal with such person in all matters of allocation and sale of plots to those owners as if the Power of Attorney contains stipulation and authority enabling such person to purchase allocated plots for and on behalf of the owners.

(ii) Persons to whom compensation shall be paid under the Scheme are those who, in the appropriate cases of multiple ownerships, are beneficiaries known to the Board after reasonable and diligent investigations.

(iii) In all cases of multiple ownerships, if the persons so entitled do not within nine months accept an offer of allocation of plot made to them or where they accept such offer of allocation but they cannot all be got together to execute a conveyance if and when such execution is deemed necessary such offer of allocation shall lapse and the Board thereafter may offer the plot to the person or persons next on its waiting list.

3. Allocation of plots by virtue of clause 4 (f) of the Scheme shall, unless otherwise agreed, be subject to the following conditions and stipulations:—

(a) Any person or persons to whom a plot is allocated shall

(i) within eighteen months from the date of the conveyance to him commence and complete building on the said plot to the approval of the Board, and

(ii) observe and perform such conditions, restrictions, stipulations and other requirements and regulations imposed by the Board.

(b) The foregoing provisions shall be binding upon those claiming through and under such person or persons aforesaid.”

COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS  
AUSTRALIAN AWARDS, 1961

Under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan the Australian Government is offering approximately ten scholarships to men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth. The scholarships will mainly be for post-graduate study and will be available in institutions of higher learning in Australia from the beginning of the academic year in March 1961.

2. These awards are similar in many respects to the Commonwealth Scholarships recently offered by the Government of the United Kingdom.

3. *Tenure*.—These scholarships will in general be tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a university degree or similar qualification. In exceptional cases an award may be made for a year only and in appropriate circumstances (e.g., a post-graduate scholar whose work for higher degree is found to require three years) it may be extended for a third year. Each award will be made on the understanding that it will be continued for the period of the programme of study or research for which it is granted provided the scholar's progress and conduct are satisfactory.

4. *Emoluments*.—The emolument will cover expenses of travel, living and study during the tenure of the scholarship as well as an initial clothing grant and a marriage allowance in the case of scholars accompanied by their wives.

5. *Eligibility*.—Candidates must be normally Commonwealth citizens or British Protected persons who are at the time of taking up awards in 1961 graduates of a university or college in their countries or holders of an equivalent qualification. Awards will not be made for courses leading to a first degree or its equivalent which are available at the University College, Ibadan, and the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology.

6. *Age Limit*.—Applicants should in general be less than 28 years of age on 1st March, 1961 but in special circumstances this age limit may be raised.

7. *Method of application*.—Applications should in the first instance be made by letter direct to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos, for all candidates who live in Nigeria and West Africa. In the case of persons resident in the United Kingdom and Europe applications should be forwarded through the Commissioner for Nigeria in the United Kingdom; while those resident in North America should forward their applications through the Liaison Officer, Washington 6, D. C. All applications should supply the following information:—

**Training.**—(a) Candidates selected will undertake an 11 month's Course at the Institute of Administration, Zaria. A Man O'War Bay Training Course, designed for training in leadership and physical endurance, will be held during the course.

(b) The attainment of a Class A Pass on the successful completion of the course will render a student eligible for consideration for appointment as an Administrative Officer in the salary scale A1 (£624-1,380); students who obtain a Class B Pass will be eligible for consideration for appointment in the Executive Grade. Students who take the final examinations but do not obtain either a Class A or Class B Pass may be returned to their former employment.

## 2.—LEGAL TRAINING COURSE

Leading to the qualification of Barrister-at-Law with a view of eventual employment in the Public Service of the Northern Region in a legal or judicial capacity.
