- The Scheme is amended by the insertion immediately after the Third Schedule of the following new Schedule-

"FOURTH SCHEDULE (Clause 4 (f)) CONDITIONS OF SALE, CONVEYANCING ARRANGEMENTS AND BUILDING COVENANTS

- 1. When upon the acceptance of an offer of allocation of plot part of the purchase price is paid by way of deposit and nothing further is done thereafter within a period of twelve months by the intending purchaser towards the completion of the sale, such deposit shall be refunded to the depositor whereupon the contract of sale shall determine provided a notice has been served on the depositor requesting him to complete the contract within thirty days from the date of such notice and the contract has not been so completed.
- 2. (i) In all cases of multiple owne ships where compensation is paid by the Board to any person acting under a Power of Attorney from those owners, the Board shall have the right to deal with such person in all matters of allocation and sale of plots to those owners as if the Power of Attorney contains stipulation and authority enabling such person to purchase allocated plots for and on behalf of the owners.
- (ii) Persons to whom compensation shall be paid under the Scheme are those who, in the appropriate cases of multiple ownerships, are beneficiaries known to the Board after reasonable and diligent investigations.
- (iii) In all cases of multiple ownerships, if the persons so entitled do not within nine months accept an offer of allocation of plot made to them or where they accept such offer of allocation but they cannot all be got together to execute a conveyance if and when such execution is deemed necessary such offer of allocation shall lapse and the Board thereafter may offer the plot to the person or persons next on its waiting list.
- Allocation of plots by virtue of clause 4 (f) of the Scheme shall, unless otherwise agreed, be subject to the following conditions and stipulations :-
 - (a) Any person or persons to whom a plot is allocated shall
 - (i) within eighteen months from the date of the conveyance to him commence and complete building on the said plot to the approval of the Board, and
 - (ii) observe and perform such conditions, restrictions, stipulations and other requirements and regulations imposed by the Board.

COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS AUSTRALIAN AWARDS, 1961

Under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan the Australian Government is offering approximately ten scholarships to men and women students from other parts of the Common-The scholarships will mainly be for postgraduate study and will be available in institutions of higher learning in Australia from the beginning of the academic year in March 1961.

2. These awards are similar in many respects to the Commonwealth Scholarships recently offered by the Government of the United Kingdom.

- 3. Tenure.—These scholarships will in general be tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a university degree or similar qualification. In exceptional cases an award may be made for a year only and in appropriate circumstances (e.g., a post-graduate scholar whose work for higher degree is found to require three years) it may be extended for a third year. Each award will be made on the understanding that it will be continued for the period of the programme of study or research for which it is granted provided the scholar's progress and conduct are satisfactory.
- 4. Emoluments.-The emolument will cover expenses of travel, living and study during the tenure of the scholarship as well as an initial clothing grant and a marriage allowance in the case of scholars accompanied by their wives.
- Eligibility.—Candidates must be normally Commonwealth citizens or British Protected persons who are at the time of taking up awards in 1961 graduates of a university or college in their countries or holders of an equivalent qualification. Awards will not be made for courses leading to a first degree or its equivalent which are available at the University College, Ibadan, and the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology.
- 6. Age Limit.—Applicants should in general be less than 28 years of age on 1st March, 1961 but in special circumstances this age limit may be raised.
- 7. Method of application.—Applications should in the first instance be made by letter direct to the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Education. Lagos, for all candidates who live in Nigeria and West Africa. NORTHERN REGIONAL GOVERNMENT TRAINING COURSES 1960-61

- (1) Administrative Service
- (2) Legal Service
- (3) Executive Grade.

Applications are invited by 31st March, 1960, at the latest from suitably qualified Nigerians of Northern origin in respect of the undermentioned Training Courses for appointments in the Public Service of the Northern Regional Government.

1.—Administrative Service Training Course

Qualifications.—(a) Normally candidates for the Administrative Service require a University Degree. As a temporary measure holders of either the West African School Certificate or an equivalent pass in the General Certificate of Education (six passes at ordinary level) will be considered as candidates.

(b) In exceptional cases consideration will be given to candidates holding lower educational qualifications than in (a) above, who have acquired additional relevant qualifications, and have also supplemented their education by substantial administrative experience (up to the level of a Pass on the Assistant Executive Officers' Training Course) in Government or Native Administrative Service or in Commercial employment.

(c) Candidates must be physically fit, and over the age of 22 and under 30 at 1st August, 1960.

Training.—(a) Candidates selected will undertake an 11 month's Course at the Institute of Administration, Zaria. A Man O'War Bay Training Course, designed for training in leadership and physical endurance, will be held during the course.

(b) The attainment of a Class A Pass on the successful completion of the course will render a student eligible for consideration for appointment as an Administrative Officer in the salary scale A1 (£624-1,380); students who obtain a Class B Pass will be eligible for consideration for appointment in the Executive Grade. Students who take the final examinations but do not obtain either a Class A or Class B Pass may be returned to their former employment.

2.—LEGAL TRAINING COURSE

Leading to the qualification of Barrister-at-Law with a view of eventual employment in the Public Service of the Northern Region in a legal or Judicial capacity.

Qualifications.—(a) General Certificate of Education (in which a Pass in English and in Latin or Arabic must be certified) in order to satisfy the requirements of Regulation 1 of the Consolidated Regulations of the Inns of Court. In Exceptional circumstances consideration may be given to persons holding lesser qualifications provided that approval thereto is obtained from the Masters of the Bench of the Inn of Court to which the candidate is seeking admission.

(b) Candidates must be physically fit. Age limit 21-40.

Training.—(c) Candidates selected will undertake a course of approximately ten months duration commencing on or about 1st August, at the Institute of Administration, Zaria, where instructions will be given in English, Constitutional Law and Legal History, Criminal Law, the Law of Contract and Tort and in Roman Law, to the standard required in the Preliminary Examinations of the Bar Council. Arrangements will be made for candidates to sit these examinations in Nigeria during the course. Successful candidates will be considered for further training in the United Kingdom for the professional qualification of Barrister-at-Law.

(d) Upon the attainment of the qualification of Barrister-at-Law and upon satisfactory completion of any further training required by the Public Service Commission, successful candidates will be eligible for consideration for appointment as pupil Crown Counsel in the first instance, or Legal Assistants in the Public Service of the Region, and upon completion of two years' practice as Crown Counsel, for the post of Magistrate.

3.—Assistant Executive Officer-in-Training (Long Course)

Salary scale.—C(E) Training—(£270; £294; £318) and C(E) 1, 2 (£390 to £714).

Qualifications.—Candidate for Assistant Executive Officer-in-Training (long course) must be of Northern origin and are normally required to hold a minimum educational qualification of School Certificate or General Certificate of Education with six passes at Ordinary Level. Candidates awaiting the result of their School Certificate examination may apply.

Candidates from either Government or Native Authority Services whose basic educational qualifications are less than the above but who have also given proof of integrity, ability, energy, responsibility and adaptability in their employment since leaving school, will be considered provided they have attained at least the grade of Second-class Clerk or its equivalent.

Candidates must be physically fit.

Training.—Successful candidates will be required to undergo a course of one year's duration in general education in English, Economics, Local Government and in Government Procedure and Regulations. On successful completion of the Course direct entrants will remain on probation in the Training Grade for a further period of two years and thereafter they will be considered for substantive appointment as Assistant Executive Officers, while those already in Government Service may be considered for promotion to the post of Assistant Executive Officer at any time after successful completion of the Course. Candidates from Native Authorities will be considered also on the same basis as those from Government.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

All applications, which should be completed on Form PSC (N.R.) 1, should be addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, so as to reach him not later than the 31st March, 1960.

Candidates wishing to apply for more than one of the above Courses should indicate on their application the Courses for which they wish to be considered in order of preference.

Candidates whose qualifications appear to reach the standard may be called for one or more interviews in Kaduna.

Applicants in N.A. Service should forward their applications through their Native Authority and the Resident, requesting both to attach confidential reports. Applicants in Government Service should forward their applications through their Resident or Permanent Secretary, as the case may be, who should attach a confidential report. Applicants who are neither in Government nor N.A. Service should forward their applications through their present employer, asking him to attach a report. It is essential that every applicant should give a complete and detailed account of all employment since leaving school.

Duplicate copies of applications may be forwarded direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, for information. The Secretary, Public Service Commission, may request each of the three referees nominated by candidates for a confidential report on the applicant, and may require also a report to cover a candidate's employment since leaving school.
