OILS ORDINANCE (CAP. 135)

This notice is published to expand and modify the terms of Government Notice No. 2675 published in the Federation of Nigeria *Official Gazette* No. 76 of the 17th December, 1959, regarding Licences and Leases granted under the Mineral Oils Ordinance, Chapter 135.

## (1) Paragraph A.—Oil Exploration Licence.

*Rights.*—1. Delete paragraph as in Government Notice 2675 and substitute the following:—

"This licence gives the holder the right to undertake geological and geophysical exploration for oil over land and territorial waters of Nigeria excluding land approved for grant or already granted to oil operators and land for which a premium is being charged".

(2) Paragraph B.—Oil Exploration Licence (Modified) under the heading "Forms of Title", is cancelled.

(3) Paragraph C.—Oil Prospecting Licence, subparagraph 2 "Obligations". In subparagraph (iii) it is intended that the obligation to have drilled 12,000 feet by the end of the third year shall apply only to land and territorial water areas. On continental shelf areas the obligation is extended to be applicable before the end of the fourth year.

It has also been decided that where two continental shelf concessions have been applied for by one operator, the obligations under this paragraph shall apply to any two areas whether contiguous or separate.

This notice is further amplified in that no one operator will be allowed more than four continental shelf concessions.

(4) Paragraph D.—Oil Mining Lease, subparagraph 8—Royalty. In subparagraphs (iv) and (v) it should be explained that the royalty on casinghead spirit and natural gas will be modified on continental shelf areas in the same proportions as those given for royalties on crude oil (paragraphs (ii) and (iii)). The royalty on gas will be that on gas sold only.

(ii) In addition a running unit charge of 5d.

(iii) Supplies having a Maximum Demand in excess of 50 KVA may be subject to special agreement.

(C) Shop Window Lighting Rate.—6d per unit.

(D) *Street Lighting Rate.*—As for B Commercial and Industrial Rate above but in addition in the event of the Street Lighting Fittings being the property of the Lighting Authority, and the Lighting Authority wishing the Corporation to maintain its Street Lighting System, a monthly charge per lamp, sufficient to cover the Corporation for routine inspection, cleaning and painting of fittings, standards and brackets, lamp replacements, maintenance of control equipment and general maintenance of the public lighting system.

Where the Street Lighting Fittings are the property of the Corporation, the Corporation may in addition to the above mentioned charges require the Lighting Authority to pay a charge to cover the cost of this equipment and at the same time require the Lighting Authority to enter into a special agreement to use the equipment and pay the charges for a minimum period of years not exceeding ten.

(E) *Welding Rate.*—For any plant other than that incorporating a Motor Generator, in addition to any monthly demand charge and unit charge and additional fixed monthly charge of £1-0s-0d per KVA or part thereof of the manufacturers rated input of welding plant installed. In cases where capacitors are installed this additional fixed charge will be reduced in relation to the improvement of the power factor.

(F) *General Purpose Rate.*—1s-6d per unit.

(G) *Combined Rate.*—Where in the opinion of the Corporation a single premises has an installation to which the application of more than one of the above rates would be appropriate, they may charge as a single rate such combination of the foregoing rates as in the circumstances they may deem appropriate.

(H) *Connection Charges.*—For each new connection the consumer shall pay to the Corporation a fee of £1-0s-0d which shall be in addition to any service charge or capital contribution which the Corporation might demand.

## POST OFFICE ORDINANCE (CHAPTER 174)

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 11 of the Post Office Ordinance, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 46 of 1958, the Minister of Communications has determined that a Business Reply Service shall be introduced with effect from the 1st of April, 1960.

2. The aim of introducing the Service is to enable commercial firms or other organisations to obtain replies from clients without putting clients to the expense of paying postage. A commercial firm or other organisation wishing to take advantage of this Service may enclose in its communications an unstamped card, business envelope or address label of a special design. The commercial firm or other organisation may also incorporate in its advertisements in newspapers and other publications the special design which may be cut out and used as an address label. The client can post the card, envelope or address label in the ordinary way but without a stamp, and the commercial firm or other organisation will pay the postal charges upon all replies received by them.

3. The Service will be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) Before any commercial firm or other organisation issues business reply cards, envelopes or address labels, a licence must be obtained from the Director of Posts and Telegraphs, which will be issued on his behalf by the local Head Postmaster. (A *pro forma* of the licence is reproduced at the end of this Notice).

(b) A printed proof of the design of the card, envelope or address label must be submitted to the Head Postmaster for approval before the licensee issues them.

(c) The postage payable on each card, envelope or address label returned through the post to the licensee will be the ordinary postage plus a handling charge of one penny. For example, an ordinary letter on which the postage is normally three pence would be charged four pence; a printed paper item normally one penny would be charged two pence.

(d) The licensee will be required to pay in advance a sum of money (not less than £2) sufficient to cover the amount of the charge likely to accrue during one month, and to make further payments to renew his credit from time to time.

(e) In all other respects the cards, envelopes, or address labels will be subject to the general regulations and rules of the Inland Postal Service.

## LICENCE FOR THE USE OF BUSINESS REPLY CARDS, ENVELOPES, ETC.

## WHEREAS

(hereinafter called "the Licensee") has applied to the Director of Posts and Telegraphs (hereinafter called the "Director" which expression shall also include his agents and successors in office) for permission:

(1) to use and issue to correspondents reply cards, envelopes, folders, and labels to be affixed to cards and envelopes, transmitted to the Licensee (at the above mentioned address) as postal packets without repayment of postage,

(2) to incorporate in the Licensee's advertisements in newspapers and other publications a design intended to be cut out and used as an address label adhering completely to cards or envelopes, or as a folder suitable for transmission by post under Postal regulations.

NOW THEREFORE the Director hereby grants his licence and permission to the Licensee to use and issue cards, envelopes, folders and labels and to advertise the said design for such purposes aforesaid subject to the following conditions :

(a) The Licensee shall pay in advance such sum of money as the Director shall deem sufficient (not less than two pounds) in respect of the charges likely to be incurred on postal packets transmitted under the arrangements aforesaid, and shall from time to time during the continuance of this licence pay on demand such further sums as the Director may deem necessary.

(b) A specimen of all cards, envelopes, folders and labels proposed to be issued to correspondents and of the advertisements in which the said design is proposed to be incorporated for use as aforesaid shall be forwarded by the Licensee to the Director for approval and shall not be used until such approval has been given.]

(c) The charge on each postal item transmitted to the Licensee under the arrangements aforesaid shall be that fixed from time to time by or under the Posts Office Ordinance.

(d) The cards, envelopes and folders :—

(i) shall be transmitted to the Licensee only if they are posted in Nigeria or the Cameroons under British Trusteeship ; and

(ii) shall be subject to the Regulations and Rules of the Inland Postal Service

(e) The Licence may be revoked by the Director by seven days notice in writing to the Licensee at any time and may be revoked forthwith by the Director by notice in writing to the Licensee in the event of any breach of the Licensee of any of the conditions herein contained, and the Licensee shall be entitled to the return of any unexhausted balance of the sum paid under Condition 1 hereof less any sum due to the Director.

(f) Any notice under this Licence from the Director to the Licensee shall be sufficiently given if left at or sent by post addressed to him at the address mentioned above or at the Licensee's last known or usual place of address.
