FOREIGN COMPENSATION

The Foreign Compensation (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics)

(Registration) Order, 1959

 20th November, 1959 26th November, 1959

Coming into Operation 27th November, 1959
At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of November, 1959
Present.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Foreign Compensation Act, 1950(a), (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") Her Majesty is authorised, if Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom enter into or contemplate an agreement with the Government of any foreign country providing for the payment of compensation by the latter Government, to make provision by Order in Council for the registration by the Foreign Compensation Commission (thereinafter referred to as "the Commission") of claims to participate in such compensation, and for the making of reports by the Commission with respect to such claims:

And Whereas Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom contemplate such an agreement with the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics:

And Whereas it is now deemed expedient that provision for the registration of claims and the making of reports should be made in pursuance of the aforementioned provisions of section 3 of the Act:

Now, Therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Act, or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I,-INTERPRETATION

- 1.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if this Order were an Act of Parliament.
 - (2) In this Order:—

"The Baltic States" means Lithuania (including Memel and the city and territory of Vilna), Estonia and Latvia.

"British nationals" means

- (a) individuals who are, or would have been had the British Nationality Act, 1948(c), and the British Protectorates, Protected States and Protected Persons Orders in Council, 1949 to 1958(a), been in force at the relevant date, citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies, British subjects without citizenship as defined in section 13 of that Act, or British protected persons as defined in section 32 of that Act; provided that, as regards any relevant date prior to the sixteenth day of May, 1948, the expression "British protected persons" shall be deemed to include a person who was at that date a Palestinian citizen under the Palestinian Citizenship Orders, 1925 to 1942(b);
- (b) individuals who are, or would have been had the Citizenship of Rhodesia and Nyasaland and British Nationality Act, 1957, been in force at the relevant date, citizens of Rhodesia and Nyasaland;
- (c) corporations, firms and associations incorporated or constituted under the laws in force in the United Kingdom or in any territory for whose international relations Her Majesty's Government are (or were at the relevant date) responsible.

"The ceded territories" means

- (a) those territories whose cession to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics by Finland and by Roumania, respectively, was confirmed by the Treaties of Peace with Finland and with Roumania signed on the tenth day of February, 1947;
- (b) those territories which were transferred to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics by Poland under Agreements between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Poland signed, respectively, on the sixteenth day of August, 1945, and the fifteenth day of February, 1951;
- (c) those territories which were transferred to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics by Czechoslovakia under an Agreement signed on the twenty-sixth day of June, 1945, between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Czechoslovakia;
- (d) those territories which were transferred to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics by Finland under an Agreement signed on the third day of February, 1947, between Finland and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

"Debt" means a sum due or owing, or a claim for unliquidated damages, or a sum deposited in a bank in the Baltic States or in the ceded territories, but not transferred

in respect of :--

(a) a contract for the sale of goods or a bill of exchange given for the discharge of obligations under any such contract, or

- (b) the servicing, preservation, transport, insuring or advertising of goods in the course of trade, whether or not the goods are the subject of any such contract as aforesaid, or
- (c) agency contracts other than those relating to contracts of insurance or to treaties or contracts or reinsurance, or
 - (d) a contract for the payment of royalties or for the manufacture of goods under licence, or
 - (e) professional charges or disbursements, or
- (f) a contract of insurance (including life and endowment assurance but not including a treaty or contract of reinsurance) concluded with an insurance company incorporated or constituted in the Baltic States or in the ceded territories, or
 - (g) shipping or transport services, or

(k) an advance, loan, acceptance credit, or other facility originally granted in the course of business by a British national to a person or corporation resident in the Baltic States or in the ceded territories.

"Date of cession" means the tenth day of February, 1947, in the case of territories whose cession to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics was confirmed by the Treaties of Peace with Finland and Roumania signed on that date; and, in the case of other ceded territories, the date of the signature of the Agreement with the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics under which the territory was transferred to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

"Property" includes all rights or interests of any kind in property, other than debts.

PART II.—REGISTRATION OF CLAIMS

- An application to the Commission to register a claim in accordance with the provisions of this Order may be made by any person who is, at the date on which the application is made, a British national.
- 3. The Commission shall register any claim in respect of which an application has been received under the provisions of Article 2 of this Order and which is:
 - (1) a claim in respect of a debt which on the sixth day of August, 1940, was outstanding to a British national from a person or corporation (other than a British national) resident in the Baltic States and which is still outstanding; or
 - (2) a claim in respect of a debt which on the date of cession was outstanding to a British national from a person or corporation (other than a British national) resident in the ceded territories and which is still outstanding: or
 - (3) a claim arising out of a loan or obligation issued or guaranteed between the twenty-eighth day of June 1919, and the third day of September, 1939, by the Government of any of the Baltic States; provided that on the twenty-third day of November, 1959, the holder of the bond or other document of title in respect of which the claim is made was a British national; or
 - (4) a claim arising out of a loan or obligation issued by any municipal authority in the territory of any of the Baltic States before the sixth day of August, 1940, provided that on the twenty-third day of November, 1959, the holder of the bond or other document of title in respect of which the claim is made was a British national; or
 - (5) a claim arising out of a loan or obligation issued before the date of cession by any municipal authority in the ceded territories; provided that on the twenty-third day of November, 1959, the holder of the bond or other document of title in respect of which the claim is made was a British national; or
 - (6) a claim in respect of shares held on the twenty-third day of November, 1959, by a British national in a company which was originally incorporated or constituted in the Baltic States or in the ceded territories and which was carrying on business on the first day of July, 1940, or at the date of cession as the case may be or
 - (7) a claim in respect of a balance held by a British national on the sixth day of August, 1940, at a bank in one of the Baltic States; or
 - (8) a claim in respect of a balance held on the date of cession by a British national at a bank in one of the ceded territories; or
 - (9) a claim in respect of property in the Baltic States which was owned by a British national before the sixth day of August, 1940, and of which he has been deprived of the ownership or enjoyment by confiscation, nationalisation, exprepriation or dispossession on or after the first day of July, 1940; or
 - (10) a claim in respect of property in the ceded territories which was owned by a British national before the date of cession, and of which he has been deprived of the ownership or enjoyment by confiscation, nationalisation, exprepriation or dispossession after the date of cession.
- 4. The Commission shall not register under this Order any claim which has already been established
- The Commission shall report, in such manner as Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Affairs may direct, upon any claims registered in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this
- 6. In exercising their functions under this Order, the Commission shall act in their administrative

PART III .- GENERAL

7. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of November, 1959, and may be cited as the Foreign Compensation (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) (Registration) Order, 1959.

To: All Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Federal Departments

GENERAL LEVEL OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE FEDERAL PUBLIC SERVICE

I am directed to convey to you the following decisions of Government concerning the subject indicated above:—

- (a) that no new posts should be created in future without the approval of the Council of Ministers;
- (b) that there should be no recruitment to posts which have remained vacant for more than two years, and that this Ministry should be provided with details of such posts immediately and a copy of each notification should be sent to the Ministry of Finance;
- (c) that in submitting the notification in sub-paragraph (b) above, each Ministry should consider whether recruitment to any of the posts is necessary and should inform this Ministry and the Ministry of Finance of those posts which it considers need not be filled.
- 2. It is proposed that this restriction should operate for a period of two years; thereafter the situation will be reviewed in order to determine whether any relaxation is necessary. As regards the following classes, however, the restriction will not be rigid although it will still be necessary for the conditions in paragraph 1 above to be fulfilled:—

Police

Professional class posts

Stenographic class posts (Stenographers; Secretary-Typists; Personal Secretaries, Grades I and II; Official Reporters, Grades I and II; Stenographic Assistants but NOT Typists).

- 3. Recruitment arising from wastage.—(a) If vacancies arise as a result of the departure of a holder of a post (e.g., as a result of resignation, retirement, transfer, removal from the service, dismissal, invaliding, promotion, etc.) recruitment to replace wastage may take place provided the prior approval of this Office is obtained. In the case of a vacant promotion post that post may be filled in consonance with the normal procedure, but any resulting lower grade vacancy cannot be filled without the prior approval of this Office.
- (b) In cases of officers going on study courses, courses of instruction, etc., the present practice is to authorise the creation of supernumerary posts to allow a relief to be recruited. This practice will cease. Officers absent from duty for the reasons already stated may be replaced by a temporary appointment being made in consultation with this Office. That appointment will be terminated on the resumption of duty of the substantive holder of the post.
- (c) If an officer sent on a study course, etc., subsequently qualifies for and receives promotion the resulting vacancy may be filled as set out in sub-paragraph (a).
- 4. Creation of New Posts.—The procedure set out in the Federal Establishment Secretary's Circular No. A.1/1959 still applies and care should be taken to initiate requests for new posts as soon as the need for them is apparent. Applications for new posts should give full supporting reasons and the request will be considered and processed in this Office. No Advance Proposal may be put forward unless the new post has actually been approved.
- 5. Nigerianisation.—The decisions conveyed in this circular will not interfere with any decision already taken by Government the aim of which is to speed up Nigerianisation in the professional and administrative classes. This means that the decision in Government Notice No. 1912 published in Gazette No. 70, Vol. 45 of the 9th October, 1958, where it was stated that in the interests of Nigerianisation Scale A and B posts could be over-established by 25 per cent of the authorised establishment, will continue to operate.
- 6. Staff Inspection.—A separate circular will shortly be issued giving details of a general staff inspection which this Ministry proposes to organise in order to ascertain the true staff requirements in the various Ministries and Departments. In the circular the co-operation of Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Departments will be sought to enable the Service as a whole to reap the full fruits of the inspection.
- 7. This circular is issued on a wide and liberal basis and will be republished as a Government Notice in three successive issues of the Official Gazette. Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Departments are requested to ensure that the circular or the Government Notice or both are immediately brought to the personal attention of ALL Senior Officers and those responsible for recruitment at all levels. Arrangements should also be made to ensure that ALL Staff are aware of the decisions conveyed above.

ALLOCATION OF PLOTS

An area of about 170 acres in the South-West Ikoyi/Obalende area of Lagos between Bourdillon Road and the Creek Hospital has been reclaimed and is now being developed under the South-West Ikoyi Reclamation and Development Scheme.

It is expected that the demand will greatly exceed the number of plots available in which case allocation will be made by ballot.

The closing date for the receipt of application forms from persons in categories B and C will be the 30th of June, 1960, and no late applications will be considered.
