Public Lands Acquisition Ordinance (Chapter 185)

Land required for the Service of the Federal Government

Notice is hereby given that ALL that parcel of land between Ogidigbe and Madagho Villages, in Warri Division, Delta Province, Western Region, Nigeria containing an area of approximately 124 acres the boundaries of which are described below is required by the Governor-General for public purposes for a term of six years from 14th April, 1960, and in particular for installations connected with improvement of navigational facilities.

#### DESCRIPTION
