Nigeria (Constitution) Orders in Council, 1954 to 1959

APPOINTMENT OF ACTING FEDERAL JUSTICE

By His Excellency Anthony Geoffrey Hopwood Gardner-Brown, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria,

WHEREAS by section 138 of the Nigeria (Constitution) Order in Council, 1954, it is provided that the Judges of the Federal Supreme Court shall include two Federal Justices or such greater number as may be prescribed by or under any law enacted by the Federal Legislature, and such acting Federal Justices as may be appointed:

AND WHEREAS by paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 139 of the said Order in Council the Governor-General acting in his discretion may appoint a person qualified for appointment as a Federal Justice to act as a Federal Justice:

Now, THEREFORE, I, ANTHONY GEOFFREY HOPWOOD GARDNER-BROWN, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government and Commanderin-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby appoint the Honourable Mr Justice John Idowu Conrad TAYLOR to act, during my pleasure, as a Federal Justice as from the 30th day of May, 1960, and until further
