NOTICE is hereby given that all that parcel of land at Kirikiri in Badagry Division, Colony Province, Western Region of Nigeria containing an area of approximately 155.07 acres, the boundaries of which are described below is required by the Governor-General for public purposes absolutely and in particular for Flying Training School.
