#### NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

Customs and Excise Notice No. 26

EXCISE DUTY ON SOAP, SOAP PRODUCTS AND DETERGENTS MANUFACTURED IN NIGERIA

Commencement: 9th December, 1960

1. Law.—Customs and Excise Management Ordinance, 1958 Part VIIA, sections 107A to 107c. Part VIII, sections 108 to 119.

Excise Tariff Ordinance, 1958, published as Legal Notice 159/1959:-

Schedule of goods liable to Excise duty, Item No. 4 added by Legal Notice No. 193/1960.

General Excise Regulations, 1960, published as Legal Notice 114 of 1960.

- Purpose.— This Notice contains the Board's requirements consequent upon the imposition of the Excise Duty.
- 3. Duty Charge.— Duty is payable on and after 9th December, 1960, on all soap, soap products and detergents manufactured in Nigeria, other than those which the Board accepts as NOT manufactured in a factory as defined in the Factories Ordinance, 1955.
- 4. Factory.— A factory having less than ten persons engaged in manual labour would normally be considered by the Board as qualifying for exemption from licensing under the Ordinance.
- 5. Claim to Exemption.— Owners of factories manufacturing soap, soap products and detergents entitled to exemption from licensing and payment of duty should address their claim by letter to the nearest Collector of Customs and Excise.
- 6. Payment of Duty.— Duty is payable at the rate prescribed at the time of manufacture (Regulation 16) but by arrangement with the Chief Collector may be paid monthly in arrear, subject to any conditions which may be imposed in accordance with Regulation 16 (2).
- 7. Keeping of Records.— Regulations 7, 14 and 15 require the keeping by licensed manufacturers of registers of materials, products and manufacturing operations. Attention is also drawn to section 113 of the Customs and Excise Management Ordinance which empowers the Board to inspect books and records of traders manufacturing goods liable to Excise duty and to require certificates of audit signed by an approved accountant. The form of return showing quantities manufactured and the duty payable will be advised to manufacturers by the Chief Collector.
- 8. Licence and Entry of Premises.— Excise licences are issued on application to the appropriate Chief Collector and are in respect of one set of premises only. The licence fee is five pounds and should accompany each application. The Entry of Premises is a full and detailed description of the premises, plant and equipment signed by the proprietor and delivered to the Chief Collector.
- 9. Permission to manufacture.—Regulation 4 provides that no manufacturer shall store or begin to manufacture excisable goods unless he has received the written permission of the Board and made entry of the factory. Manufacturers at the time of coming into force of the duty will be granted formal permission by Chief Collectors on receipt of their application for a licence.
- 10. Stock and Stock Account.—It is important for the proper accounting of Excise duty that the products register shall clearly show the soap, soap products and detergents manufactured in any one period, deliveries of the products and balance of stock held.
  - 11. Exports.—Regulation 17 gives power to the Board to permit goods liable to excise duty manufactured

#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS, 1961 .

- 1. Objects.—In pursuance of the policy of Nigerianisation the Federal Government proposes to award; during 1961, a number of scholarships to Nigerians desiring to be trained for posts in the Federal Public Service, the statutory corporations and the teaching services of the Voluntary Agencies. Selected candidates will be required to enter into bonds to serve as directed by the Federal Government on the completion of their training. In addition a number of awards for further education will be given to students born or permanently domiciled in the Federal Territory of Lagos; this category of students will not be bonded.
- 2. Training for the Federal Public Service and for service with the Statutory Corporations.—Awards will be given in accordance with the anticipated needs of these services as notified by the Nigerianisation Officer. Awards will be given in particular in the following fields of study for first degree or professional courses:

Accountancy, Agriculture, Archaeology, Architecture, Botany, Commercial Art, Engineering (All Branches), Estate Management, Forestry, Geology, Journalism (including magazine production), Librarianship, Mathematics, Medicine, Meteorology, Oil Technology, Pharmacy, Science (All Branches), Statistics, Surveying (Land and Hydrographic), Veterinary Science.

- 3. Training for Teaching.—Awards will NOT be given in this section for economics. Candidates wishing to teach in technical institutes and trade centres will be given especially favourable consideration. Awards will be given:
  - (1) for courses leading to a general or honours degree in any subject taught in the post-primary curriculum of Nigerian educational institutions;
    - (2) for professional training of teachers at various levels;
  - (3) for courses leading to graduate qualifications in engineering or leading to the professional qualifications of the engineering institutions, including courses leading to Higher National Certificate.
- 4. Other awards for students born or permanently domiciled in Lagos. Awards in this category, which will not involve bonding to serve as directed by the Federal Government, will be made for :-
  - (1) general or honours degree courses in Mathematics and Science;
  - (2) a first degree or professional courses in Dentistry and Medicine;
  - (3) higher professional courses in Accountancy, Librarianship, Pharmacy, Secretaryship, Teaching and the Fine Arts.
- 5. Post-graduate Courses.—Post-graduate awards, except for teacher training, will NOT normally be made. Suitably qualified candidates for post-graduate studies are advised to apply for awards under the Commonwealth Scholarships and Fellowship Scheme, and similar schemes, details of which are advertised from time to time.
- 6. Persons in the Federal Public Service and Statutory Corporations.—Persons holding permanent and pensionable posts in the Federal Public Service or equivalent positions in the Statutory Corporations, who wish to pursue courses of study related to work of their departments or corporations may NOT apply for scholarships under this notice, but should apply for training awards, through their Head of Department or Corporations, to the Nigerianisation Officer.
- 7. Academic Qualifications.—Candidates should make sure that they hold the necessary academic qualifications before applying:
  - (1) For degree courses no candidate will be considered for an award who does not have the qualifications for direct entry to a university, i.e., usually passes in appropriate subjects at G.C.E. "A" level or H.S.C. at "principal" level.
  - (2) For other courses no candidate will be considered for an award who does not hold at least a Grade II School Certificate (Cambridge or West African) with credits in English Language and four other subjects allied to the proposed course of study. Equivalent qualifications gained through the General Certificate of Education will be accepted.

8. Other qualifications for candidates.—(1) Applications may be made by candidates of either sex who must be under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1961.

(2) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination which will include a tuberculin

test and X-ray examination of the chest.

9. Places of Study.—The majority of awards will be for courses now available, either wholly or in part, at Colleges in West Africa, namely:—

University College, Ibadan; University of Nigeria, Nsukka; Nigerian College of Technology, Ibadan, Enugu or Zaria; University College of Ghana; Kumasi College of Technology: University College of

Intending candidates MUST therefore acquaint themselves with the conditions of entry to these Institutions and MUST THEMSELVES apply direct for admission to the institution of their choice. Candidates will be required to produce evidence of acceptance but NO guarantee of award can be given to every applicant who has been successful in obtaining entry to one of the West African Colleges.

## BURSARIES FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL SCHOLARS

In order to encourage boys and girls who are now at grant-aided secondary schools in Lagos to become teachers, the Federal Ministry of Education will give bursaries to pay for their tuition and (at boarding schools) their board, provided accommodation is available.

2. The awards will be made to suitable selected scholars at the end of the third year of post-primary education on the application of their parents or guardians: they would be tenable, in the first instance, for two years at schools where the West African School Certificate is taken at the end of the fifth year, and for three years where it is taken at the end of the sixth year. A condition of the award would be that the scholar should, if deemed suitable for a teaching career after the completion of the School Certificate course, become qualified (with the aid of a further award) to practise as a teacher for at least five years after qualifying. The parent or guardian would be required to make a written undertaking to refund pro rata the whole or part of the bursaries received in the event of the scholar, if found suitable, failing to complete five years'

- 3. The further award to be given to selected and suitable scholars after obtaining the School Certificate would enable them to undergo a period of study at an institution of higher education leading to a recognised teaching qualification. Scholars with the requisite ability would be encouraged to take a university degree and further professional training.
- 4. Parents or guardians of scholars who are interested in this should apply to the Principal of the school concerned.
