The date of the next examination will be Saturday 1st July, 1961 for entry in January 1962.

2. It is hoped that there will be vacancies for about sixty boys at Umuahia, Afikpo, and Port Harcourt and for thirty at Owerri: and for thirty girls at Enugu.

3. There will be examination questions on English and Arithmetic based on the approved syllabus for Primary Schools.

4. The examination is open to *bona fide* pupils in Standards V and VI in Government and Voluntary Agency Schools, approved for First School Leaving Certificate, and it is not restricted to boys from Eastern Nigeria.

5. Applications for all these schools must be made through Provincial Education Officers. Application Forms may be obtained *only* from Provincial Education Officers; no reply will be given to requests for forms sent to Principals. Provincial Education Officers will send out Application Forms on request from Headmasters/Mistresses *only*; forms will *not* be sent to schools unless such requests are made.

Application Forms must be completed correctly; the attention of the Headmasters/Mistresses is drawn to the change introduced this year. The forms must reach the Provincial Education Officer not later than 14th April, 1961. The Provincial Education Officer will complete the space at the foot of the back of the form and return this section to the candidates who must produce it at the examination. If the form is incompletely or inaccurately filled in, the application is liable to be rejected. The candidate may be expelled if a false statement in his application form is discovered after he has been admitted to the School.

6. Each candidate, including Queen's School, Enugu, must pay 5s to the Treasury. (No other method of payment will be accepted). The application Form and Treasury Receipt for the 5s of each candidate must be submitted through the candidate's Headmaster to the Provincial Education Officer. Applications made or forms submitted direct to the Principal will not be entertained.

7. Candidates must be of such an age on the 1st January, 1962, that they will be likely to benefit by secondary education. Normally this age does not exceed thirteen and in no case should it exceed fourteen years at entry. Where no satisfactory evidence of age can be produced the candidate will be judged on his general physical development. No boy will be disqualified from sitting for the examination on the grounds of height alone.

8. There will be centres for the examination at Aba, Afikpo, Awka, Benin, Bida, Calabar, Enugu, Ibadan, Jos, Kaduna, Lagos, Makurdi, Ogoja, Okigwi,

Onitsha, Owerri, Port Harcourt, Umuahia, Uyo, Warri, Zaria and at other places at the discretion of the Provincial Education Officer to whom application to sit is made.

9. The School fees which are payable termly in advance are as follows:

At Afikpo and Owerri there is a laundry fee of £1 per annum. On arrival at the College each boy must deposit the sum of £3 with the Principal. This sum will be used to cover breakages and the loss of, or damage to school property. A separate account will be kept for each boy and any credit balance will be refunded to him at the end of his school career.

10. Ten open scholarships will be awarded at each of the schools Umuahia, Afikpo and Port Harcourt; and five each at the schools Owerri and Enugu. Five of the scholarships at Umuahia, Afikpo and Port Harcourt, and three of the scholarships at Owerri and Enugu will be awarded on entry to the schools, on the combined results of the Entrance Examination and of a more searching test to be held at the Interview.

The remaining five scholarships at Umuahia, Afikpo and Port Harcourt, and three at Owerri and Enugu will be awarded on progress during the first year, including performance in the first annual examination, having regard to scholarship awards already held. The scholarships, which cover Boarding and Tuition Fees only, will normally be tenable for the duration of the school career. They will, however, be subject to periodical review and, provided due warning has been given, may be withdrawn at any time on the grounds of bad conduct or bad work.

11. Admission will be to Class I only. Candidates who pass the written examination will be called, in order of merit, for an interview with the Principal who reserves the right to reject any candidate on the grounds of age or for any other reason. Candidates called for interview must bring with them two recent full face head and shoulders photographs of passport size (2" x 2"). Unsuccessful candidates will not be informed of the result of the examination and anybody who has not been called for interview by 1st October, 1961, can safely assume that he has failed the examination.

12. A full list of candidates offered admission in all five schools as fee payers or scholars will be published in an advertisement in the Daily Times on the last Saturday in September, namely Saturday 30th September, and in all Gazettes. Successful candidates will also be informed by post.

**REVOCATION OF INSTRUMENT OF TEMPORARY AUTHORITY TO PERFORM

WHEREAS, By an Instrument given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federation of Nigeria on the 15th day of November, 1960, Alhaji the Honourable MUHAMMADU RIBADU, M.B.E., was temporarily authorised to perform sundry functions conferred upon the Prime Minister by the Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria during the absence of the Prime Minister from Nigeria :

AND WHEREAS the Prime Minister returned to Nigeria on the 1st day of December, 1960 :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 85 of the Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister hereby revoke, with effect from the 1st day of December, 1960, the Instrument of temporary authority given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federation of Nigeria on the 25th day of November, 1960, as aforesaid.
