WHEREAS, By an Instrument given under the hand of the Governor-General and the Public Seal of the Federation of Nigeria on the 8th day of October, 1960, the HONOURABLE J. C. O'BANDE, M.H.R., Minister of State, was, in pursuance of section 84 of the Constitution of the Federation, temporarily assigned the duties of the Minister of Mines and Power during the absence of the Minister of Mines and Power from Nigeria:

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Mines and Power returned to Nigeria on the 24th day of December, 1960:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister hereby revoke, with effect from the 24th day of December, 1960, the Instrument of temporary assignment given under the hand of the Governor-General and the Public Seal of the Federation on the 8th day of October, 1960, as aforesaid.

NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE
(Amendment No. 7 to Customs and Excise Notice No. 13)

BUYING COMMISSION

In exercise of the power vested in the Board by section 25 (1) of the Customs and Excise Management Ordinance, 1958, and in order to prescribe the rate of buying commission to be included in the calculation of the value of imported goods for duty purposes as stipulated in paragraph 1 (3) of the Second Schedule to the Ordinance, the Board hereby directs the deletion of the whole of paragraph 11 of Government Notice No. 702 of 1959 (Customs and Excise Notice No. 13 of 1959)—“The Entry Ex Ship or Aircraft of Imported Goods for Home Consumption”—and the substitution thereof of the following:—

11. *Buying Commission.*—In calculating the value for purposes of duty a buying commission of not less than four per cent of the f.o.b. value must be included.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note does not form part of the notice published above but is intended to be of assistance to Nigerian importers and overseas suppliers.

2. This notice prescribes the rate of buying commission, to be included in the normal price for duty purposes of all goods imported into Nigeria which are liable to *ad valorem* duty.

3. The notice required action more of the Nigerian importer than of the overseas supplier and it should be noted that invoices prepared by overseas suppliers must not contain, as a result of the notice, any untrue or false statement which would constitute a contravention of the Customs and Excise Management Ordinance (55/1958).

The effect of the notice is that:—

(a) where no buying commission is charged by an overseas supplier or no such commission is shown on the relevant invoice, the importer is required, in preparing his bill of entry, to add four per cent buying commission (based on the F.O.B. value) to the dutiable value of the goods;

(b) where the buying commission charged by an overseas supplier or shown on the relevant invoice is less than four per cent of the F.O.B. value, the Nigerian importer is required to add, to the dutiable value declared on his bill of entry, an amount equal to the difference between the buying commission charged by the overseas supplier or shown on the relevant invoice and four per cent buying commission based on the F.O.B. value of the goods;

(c) where the buying commission charged by an overseas supplier or shown on the relevant invoice exceeds four per cent F.O.B. value, the Nigerian importer is required to include in the dutiable value on his bill of entry the whole of the buying commission so charged or shown.

Note: This notice replaces Government Notice 1192 published in Federal Official Gazette No. 37 of 30th June, 1960.

Qualifications.—(1) *Agricultural Engineer*.—Degree in Agriculture plus 2 years post-graduate qualification in Agricultural Engineering or degree in Engineering plus 2 years post-graduate qualification in Agricultural Engineering.
