LEGAL TRAINING COURSE, 1961-62

Applications are invited from suitably qualified Northern Nigerians in respect of a training course leading to the qualification of Barrister-at-Law with a view to eventual employment in the Public Service of Northern Nigeria in a Legal or Judicial capacity.

Candidates should possess the minimum qualification of the General Certificate of Education (in which a Pass in English and in Latin or Arabic must be certified) in order to satisfy the requirements of Regulation 1 of the Consolidated Regulations of the Inns of Court. In exceptional circumstances consideration may be given to persons holding lesser qualifications provided that approval thereto is obtained from the Masters of the Bench of the Inn of Court to which the candidate is seeking admission.

All candidates must be able to show evidence of ability, energy, integrity, responsibility and a high standard of English Language.

Candidates must be physically fit and be over twenty-one years and under forty years of age on the 1st September, 1961.

Those selected will undertake a course of approximately 12 months duration commencing on or about 1st August at the Institute of Administration, Zaria, where instruction will be given in English, Constitutional Law and Legal History, Criminal Law, the Law of Contract and Tort and in Roman Law, to the standard required in the preliminary examinations of the Bar Council. Arrangements will be made for candidates to sit these examinations in Northern Nigeria during the course. Successful candidates will be considered for further training in the United Kingdom for the professional qualification of Barrister-at-Law.

If at any time it becomes apparent that a candidate is not likely to reach the required standard he will be so informed by the Public Service Commission and consideration will be given to alternative employment according to his qualifications if he so desires it.

Upon the attainment of the qualification of Barrister-at-Law and upon completion of any further training required by the Public Service Commission, successful candidates will be eligible for appointment as Pupil Crown Counsel or Associate Magistrates in the Public Service of the Northern Nigeria and

upon completion of two years' practice in either capacity for appointment to the post of Crown Counsel or Magistrate.

During the period of the course, students not already in Government or Native Authority service will receive an allowance of £29 per month. Government or Native Authority officials will be treated as being on leave without pay, but will receive an allowance at the rate of their substantive salaries, or £29 per month, whichever is the greater. Accommodation will be provided at the Institute of Administration, as far as possible.

Method of application.—All applications which should be completed on Form PSC (NR) I, should be addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, so as to reach him not later than the 1st May, 1961.

Candidates whose qualifications appear to reach the required standard may be called for one or more interviews in Kaduna. Applicants in Native Authority service should forward their applications through their Native Authority and the Resident requesting both to attach confidential reports. Applicants in Government Service should forward their applications through their Resident or Permanent Secretary, as the case may be, who should attach a confidential report. Applicants in neither Government nor N.A. Service should forward their applications through their employers, asking them to attach a report. It is essential that every applicant should give a complete and detailed account of all employment since leaving school.

Duplicate copies of applications may be forwarded direct to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Kaduna, for information. The Secretary, Public Service Commission, may request each of the three referees nominated by candidates for a confidential report on the applicant, and may require also a report to cover candidate's employment since leaving school.

1. Dangerous Goods or Substances.

- Ammunition, other than Class VI—Division I (Ammunition of the safety class)

- Celluloid scrap, including Pyroxylin, Xylonite, etc., unless packed in substantial tin lined boxes or strong metal drums. Cellulose Acetate is not considered hazardous.
- Di-nitro-resorcinol
- Explosives, with the exception of Class VI—Division I and Class VII—Divisions I and II.
- Fireworks, other than 'shop goods'
- Fulminates
- Fulminating Powder.
- Fuses, other than those in Class VI—Divisions I and II
- Gun or Collodion Cotton, containing less than 25 per cent water moisture or more than 12.3 per cent nitrogen.
- Gunpowder
- Nitro-Glycerine
- Picric Acid
- Pyrotechnics, other than permitted 'shop goods'
- Picric Acid with less than 33½ per cent water
- Rockets, other than Signal Rockets in small quantities.
- Tetra-Nitro-Benzol
- Tri-Nitro-Naphthalene
- Tri-Nitro-Phenol
- Tri-Nitro-Toluol (T.N.T.).

2. Hazardous Goods or Substances.

(1) Hazardous goods or substances shall not be placed upon or passed over or through the Authority's quays or premises unless the contents thereof have been fully described and declared in the Shipping Note or Delivery Order.
