MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, WESTERN NIGERIA POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS, 1961-62

The Western Nigeria Government intends to award a number of scholarships this year to suitably qualified candidates. Only candidates of Western Nigeria origin will be eligible for these awards.

- 2. The scholarships awarded to candidates already in institutions either in Nigeria or overseas will be tenable from the academic year 1961-62. Awards to candidates who have gained admission to institutions but have not yet taken up residence may also be tenable from the academic year 1961-62.
- 3. Candidates who have applied for admission but have not yet gained admission to institutions overseas will be eligible for awards tenable from the academic year 1962-63 (in the event of their not gaining admission that year the awards will be cancelled but they will be eligible to re-apply the following year).
- 4. Awards will be made for the following courses of study and candidates are required to state the specific course for which they apply in all their correspondence with this Ministry:—

DEGREE COURSES

- (A) Pure Science.—General Science; Hons. Botany; Hons. Zoology, Hons. Chemistry, Hons. Physics, Hons. Geology (to be given emphasis), Hons. Mathematics, Hons. Biochemistry.
- (B) Humanities.—General B.A. Degree, Hons. B.A. in History, Hons. B.A. Geography, Hons. B.A. English, Hons. B.A. French, Hons. B.A. German.
- (C) Engineering.—Civil, Electrical, Mechanical, Water (to be given emphasis).
- (D) Agriculture.
- (E) Forestry (Both Degree Course and Professional).
- (F) Surveying (Both Degree Course and Professional Course).
- (G) Other Professional Courses.—(i) Quantity Surveying, (ii) Architecture, (iii) A.C.C.A. (iv) D.P.A., (v) Statistics, (vi) Valuation, (vii) Fitter Machinist, (viii) Dental Surgery.
- 5. Academic qualifications.—Candidates are instructed to ensure that they have the requisite qualifications for the courses for which they apply viz:—
 - (i) All applicants for Degree courses must have the West African School Certificate or its equivalent with not less than Five "Credits" including English Language and Mathematics.
 - (ii) In addition to this, applicants must have passed some subjects at the "Advanced Level" in the G.C.E. Examination or attained equivalent standards in subjects related to the course of study proposed.

Pure Science.—For courses in Pure Science which include General Science, that is, B.Sc. Degree with two or three subjects at the Final examination and Honours B.Sc. in Botany, Honours B.Sc. in Zoology, Honours B.Sc. Chemistry, Honours B.Sc. Physics, Honours B.Sc. Geology, Honours B.Sc. Mathematics and Honours B.Sc. Biochemistry, the applicants must have at least two Advanced Level Science subjects. It would be an advantage to have three Advanced Level subjects.

Humanities.—For courses in Humanities which include B.A. General Degree, that is, a B.A. degree in which two or three subjects are taken at the final examination and B.A. Honours History, B.A. Honours Geography, B.A. Honours English, B.A. Honours French and B.A. Spanish, applicants must have at least two Advanced Level Arts subjects. It would be an advantage to have three Advanced Level subjects.

Engineering.—Scholarships will be awarded for the B.Sc. Engineering Degree in (a) Civil Engineering, (b) Electrical Engineering, (c) Mechanical Engineering and (b) Water Engineering.

Applicants for courses leading to any of the above four courses in Engineering must have four subjects at the Advanced Level, these being—Physics, Chemistry, Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics. Higher School Certificate Pass in Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics taken as a combined paper may be accepted. Knowledge of surveying or Credit in Geography among the School Certificate subjects would be an additional advantage but neither is strictly necessary for consideration for scholarship awards.

Agriculture.—Qualifications for consideration for awards for Agriculture is the same as for the Pure Science B.Sc. degree, with the exception that Botany must be one of the Advanced Level subjects taken and it would be preferable if the remaining one or two of the remaining Advanced Level subjects are chosen from among Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Geology and Mathematics.

6. Non-degree course.—For courses such as Surveying and Architecture, which do not involve the taking of a University degree, the minimum qualification for a Scholarship award will be the West African School Certificate Grade I or II but not Grade III. One or two Advanced Level subjects would, of course, be an advantage.

Technical Instructor courses.—Applicants must not be below twenty-five years of age at the time of entry to a Technical College and must hold:—

(i) General Education of an approved standard (minimum of Middle II) with approved apprenticeship in a Government Trade Centre or reputable Firm and the Intermediate Certificate of City and Guilds of London Institute in the particular trade.

Note.—Awards for Diploma in Public Administration and Inter A.C.C.A. are for serving Local Government Officers only and Survey awards are for serving officers in the Survey Department of the Western Region.

Suitable candidates already serving in the Agriculture, Forestry and in the Veterinary Divisions of the Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources, will be given preference provided that they hold the requisite academic qualifications for the course.

- 7. Applications for scholarships may be made by candidates of either sex, preference being normally given to those under thirty years of age. Candidates wishing to proceed to:—
 - (a) University College, Ibadan, or to the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology, to undertake courses of study which are available must apply direct to the College Authorities to sit for examinations in accordance with the procedure prescribed and will not be eligible for awards unless they have been accepted for entry by the College Authorities.

- 8. No one under bond either to the Federal Government, any Regional Government, Corporation or Voluntary Agency who has not fully discharged the obligation of the bond should apply for an award without attaching a certificate of honourable release from the obligations to their scholarship application forms.
- 9. Originals or photostat copies of originals of Certificates must be attached to Application Forms and these may be retained in the Ministry up to the time of the interviews for the information of the Scholarship Selection Board.
- 10. Method of application.—All applications for scholarships must be completed in duplicate on the prescribed forms which may be obtained from:—

ABOLITION OF THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF MARKETING AND EXPORTS

The Federal Government has decided to abolish by 31st March, 1962 the Department of Marketing and Exports which Department has for the past twelve years been very closely associated with the executive functions of the Nigeria Produce Marketing Board system. As the Nigeria Produce Marketing Board system constitutes the most important single influence in the present-day economy of Nigeria, this decision to abolish the Department of Marketing and Exports must be a matter of public interest and calls for an explanation.

- 2. The Department of Marketing and Exports was established in September 1948 to serve as the common executive organisation of the four Nigeria Commodity Marketing Boards. In 1954, as a result of constitutional changes, the Nigeria-wide Commodity Marketing Board system was replaced by a system of four Regional Marketing Boards responsible for the internal marketing arrangements in their respective Regions, and the Nigeria Central Marketing Board responsible for the export and overseas sale of the produce purchased for export by the Regional Marketing Boards. In 1958, again as a result of a Constitutional decision, the export and operational functions of the Nigeria Central Marketing Board were taken over by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited (incorporated in Nigeria).
- 3. At the time these new Marketing Boards were formed in 1954 it was generally recognised that, as far as the Regional Boards were concerned, these bodies might wish to set up their own executive organisations in due course; but it was then decided that until the conditions for a smooth and efficient handover had been created, the Department of Marketing and Exports should continue for the time being to carry out the executive functions of all the Marketing Boards.
- 4. The Western Region Marketing Board and the Southern Cameroons Marketing Board have already set up their own independent executive organisations while it is the intention of the Eastern Nigeria Marketing Board to do so on 1st April, 1961. This will leave the Northern Regional Marketing Board and the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited as the sole employers of the services of the Department of Marketing and Exports. Both of these bodies have expressed the intention of making their own executive arrangements within the next year.
- 5. No useful purpose therefore would be served by retaining the Department in being since the

duties and functions for which the Department was specially created to perform will in future be undertaken by the separate executive organisations of the Marketing bodies concerned.

- 6. Certain former members of the Department's staff are already employed by those Regional Marketing Boards whose own executive organisations are now in existence; it is highly probable that others will be required by the Eastern Nigeria and Northern Regional Marketing Boards and the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited, Arrangements will be made within the provisions of the Government's terms and conditions of service to re-deploy in the Public Service of the Federation the small number of established Civil Servants remaining who do not wish to take up an appointment with the new executive organisations.
- 7. It must be emphasised that these new arrangements relate only to the executive organisations of the Marketing bodies concerned and in no way affect the structure of the Marketing Board system or the present arrangements under which produce controlled by the Regional Marketing Boards is exported and sold overseas by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited.
- 8. It should also be noted that the Federal Produce Inspection Service, although a component part of the Department of Marketing and Exports, will not be affected by the abolition of the Department. The terms on which the Department of Marketing and Exports was appointed as an executive instrument of the Marketing Board organisation expressly excluded the Produce Inspection Service from the The Federal Produce Inspection Service is a service of Federal Government and exercises its functions on behalf of Federal Government and not on behalf of the Marketing Board organisation. Upon the abolition of the Department of Marketing and Exports the Federal Produce Inspection Service will in its entirety be integrated with the Federal Ministry of Commerce and Industry and will continue to discharge its responsible and important duties of safeguarding the reputation of Nigerian produce by check-testing the quality of export produce at the ports of shipment.
