Item 34 "South-east Ikoyi", Items 35 and 36 "Victoria Island", Item 37 (2) "Street lighting", and Item 38 "Ijora Site Development" are being carried out by the Board as agents of the Nigerian Federal Government who pay the Contractors, etc., direct. The expenditure involved is included at Items 34, 35, 36, 37 (2) and 38 for statistical purposes only; and is deducted from Item 42 to obtain the figures taken into the Balance Sheet Item 43.

NOTE (2)

Item 21 (6) Ex-gratia Compensation Fund expenditure is limited to £200,000 for the Scheme as a whole. This sum is met from the Nigerian Federal Government grant for the Scheme.

NOTE (3)

Items 35 and 36 "Victoria Island", £40,000 has been advanced to the Board by the Nigerian Federal Government to defray the cost of compensation, removal and re-settlement of Villagers. Compensation, etc., paid to 31st March, 1961 totalled £25,372-3s-5d. The unspent balance of £14,627-16s-7d has been included in the Balance Sheet as a liability, "sundry creditors".
