NOTE (1)

Item 34 "South-east Ikoyi', Items 35 and 36 "Victoria Island", Item 37 (2) Street lighting", and Item 38 "Ijora Site Development" are being carried out by the Board as agents of the Nigerian Federal Govennment who pay the Contrators, etc., direct. The expenditure involved is included at Items 34, 35, 36, 37 (2) and 38 for statistical purposes only; and is deducted from Item 42 to obtain the figures taken into the Balance Sheet Item 43.

Note (2)

Item 21 (6) Ex-gratia Compensation Fund expenditure is limited to £200,000 for the Scheme as a whole. This sum is met from the Nigerian Federal Government grant for the Scheme.

NOTE (3)

Items 35 and 36 "Victoria Island", £40,000 has been advanced to the Board by the Nigerian Federal Government to defray the cost of compensation, removal and re-settlement of Villagers. Compensation, etc., paid to 31st March, 1961 totalled £25,372-3s-5d. The unspent balance of £14,627-16s-7d has been included in the Balance Sheet as a liability, "sundry creditors".

Items 39, 40 and 41.

As at 31-3-61 expenditure (£180,170-1s-9d) exceeded income (£133,623-19s-5d) by £46,546-2s-4d. The Nigerian Federal Government has, however, included loan provision of £60,000 for Staff Quarters within the current economic programme. The loan has not yet been taken up by the Board.

NOTE (5)

Item 35 (3) "Victoria Island, Phase I; site development" includes the purchase, trans-shipment, erection and maintenance of the Bailey Bridge used temporarily to span the Five-Cowries Creek. This Bailey Bridge was subsequently re-purchased by the Federal Ministry of Works for a nominal sum of £20,000.
