Included in this figure is an amount of £4,758-10s-8d in respect of deposits made by students for various purposes. No reconciliation has been seen of this account with the total of the individual balances of the students' accounts.

General Stores: £41,091-9s-3d

The certificate in respect of stores at the Ibadan Branch at the 31st March, 1960, shows stores surveyed to the value of £12,954-4s-8d, which is £448-1s-4d less than the amount shown in the accounts. Subsequent investigation revealed numerous errors in the stock sheet figures prepared by the Board of Survey, and it is understood that the difference in suspense has now been reduced to £21-18s-3d.

Annual Statement and Valuation of Assets

The statement required by section 23 (1) of Cap. 135, Laws of Nigeria 1960, has not been furnished for audit. It is understood that the Minister of Finance has agreed that this need not be rendered while the College is still under construction.

APPOINTMENT OF LICENSED BUYING AGENTS FOR THE 1961-62 COCOA SEASON

It is notified for general information that the Board is prepared to consider applications for appointment as licensed buying agents for the 1961-62 Cocoa Season which will open about the middle of September 1961 (the exact date will be notified later by publication in the Western Nigeria Gazette).

- 2. Applicants will be required to produce evidence that they are likely to be able to fulfil the minimum conditions set out in the following paragraphs, which are based on:—
 - (a) the normal functions which a licensed buying agent is required to perform;
 - (b) ability to purchase and handle a minimum purchase required of 0.25 per cent (i.e., one four hundredth) of an average crop. This is felt to be the lowest possible figure of purchases compatible with orderly marketing and is taken as a quantity of 250 tons for an average season;
 - (c) average conditions as regards storage, evacuation, etc., rúling in past season.

3.—Functions of Licensed Buying Agents

The main functions which licensed buying agents will be required to perform on behalf of the Board are:—

- (a) to purchase cocoa at buying stations at not less than the minimum prices;
- (b) to bag and arrange for inspection in accordance with the regulations;
- (c) to finance purchases and provide suitable storage until the time of shipment;
- (d) to make returns of purchases and stocks as the Board or its duly authorised executive may require;
- (e) to arrange for approved conveyance to port and for shipment in accordance with shipping instructions given by the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited or its duly authorised executive;
- (f) to arrange for checkweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations;
- (g) to arrange for delivery of cocoa to ocean vessel and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited or its duly authorised executive.

4. MINIMUM CONDITIONS:

(a) Purchases.—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 250 tons of cocoa (i.e., Main and Light crops inclusive):

- (b) Bags.—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to provide at least fourteen bales of 300 new bags each, and twine therefor to cover the minimum purchase requirement;
- (c) Capital.—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to satisfy the minimum capital requirement necessary to fulfil the obligations of a licensed buying agent. The minimum capital requirement is £9,000.
- (d) Storage.—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposes areas of operation proper storage to cover at least a hundred tons of cocoa, and adequate port storage where appropriate.

All stores must comply with the requirement of, and be approved by, the Western Regional Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request, in writing, the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his stores.

- (e) General.—Applicants must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that they are fully conversant with the cocoa trade and likely to be able to fulfil the following conditions:—
 - (i) Inspection of Cocoa—That they will be able to provide an adequate labour force at all stores to handle cocoa at the time of inspection.
 - (ii) Returns.—That they will render promptly and accurately all returns, particularly of purchases and stocks, which may be called for.
 - (iii) Evacuation.—That they will be able to make arrangements to secure the neccessary transport by road, rail and water to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of cocoa by approved routes.
 - (iv) Shipping Documents.—That they possess the necessary organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required by the Board, and the carrying out of all duties involved in the delivery of cocoa to f.o.b. point.
- 5. METHOD OF APPLICATION.—Application forms and details as to their completion can be obtained from the Headquarters of the Western Region Marketing Board, Onireke, Ibadan.
- 6. Firms and persons wishing to apply must forward their application forms, duly and correctly completed in duplicate, to reach the Secretary, Western Region Marketing Board, Stone Road, Private Mail Bag No. 5032, Ibadan, not later than the 22nd May, 1961. Applications received after the closing date will not be considered. Firms and persons already appointed as licensed buying agents under the current Marketing Scheme are not required to reapply.

- 2. The last date for the receipt of completed entry forms is 14th June, 1961, and forms will be issued up to 7th June, 1961.
- 3. Admission to the General Certificate of Education Examination is restricted to candidates who possess one of the qualifications listed in the Local Regulations which are issued with the entry forms. Other candidates are required to take the Qualifying Test. Any person, who is not certain whether or not he is eligible to enter for the General Certificate of Education Examination should send an inquiry to the Deputy Registrar, West African Examinations Council, Yaba.
- 4. This notice also applies to successful candidates, in the Qualifying Test which took place on the 7th January, 1961, who have received their notification of result without the entry form. They should now apply for the entry form if they wish to enter for the January 1962 General Certificate of Education Examination.
