OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR ENTRY INTO THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE WESTERN NIGERIA PUBLIC SERVICE, 1961

The Open Competitive Examination for a limited number of vacancies in the General Executive Class of the Western Region Public Service will be held on Monday and Tuesday, the 25th and 26th of September, 1961 respectively.
